The Lafayette Linear Park is a paved trail on the southern side of Lafayette, Indiana. The trail occupies a rail corridor once used by



The Lafayette Linear Park is a paved trail on the southern side of Lafayette, Indiana. The trail occupies a rail corridor once used by the Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago and St. Louis Railway (popularly known as the Big Four Railroad) and abandoned by Conrail in the 1980s. Clear evidence of Lafayette's extensive rail history can be found today: the trail parallels an active Norfolk Southern line for its entire length.

Lafayette's popular Armstrong Park is accessible via a short walk or ride east on the sidewalks along Beck Lane from the trail's northern trailhead. The 30-acre park contains a playground, picnic shelter, tennis and basketball courts, baseball fields, open space, an aquatic center and a large pond where fishing is permitted.


Parking & Trail Access
