The North Bank Trail will one day stretch 18 miles from Spring Lake to Marne, on the western outskirts of Grand Rapids.



The North Bank Trail will one day stretch 18 miles from Spring Lake to Marne, on the western outskirts of Grand Rapids. Currently, six miles are complete on the trail's western end, beginning at a connection to the [Lakeside Trail](#) in the Village of Spring Lake and ending in Nunica, MI. This section parallels State Route 104 along the former Grand Trunk Railroad. Eventually, the trail will continue farther east to Coopersville and the Musketawa Trail in Marne.

The North Bank Bridge connects to the [Spoonville Trail](#) in Nunica, which includes a great bridge over the Grand River that also provides a connection to the Idema Explorers Trail.

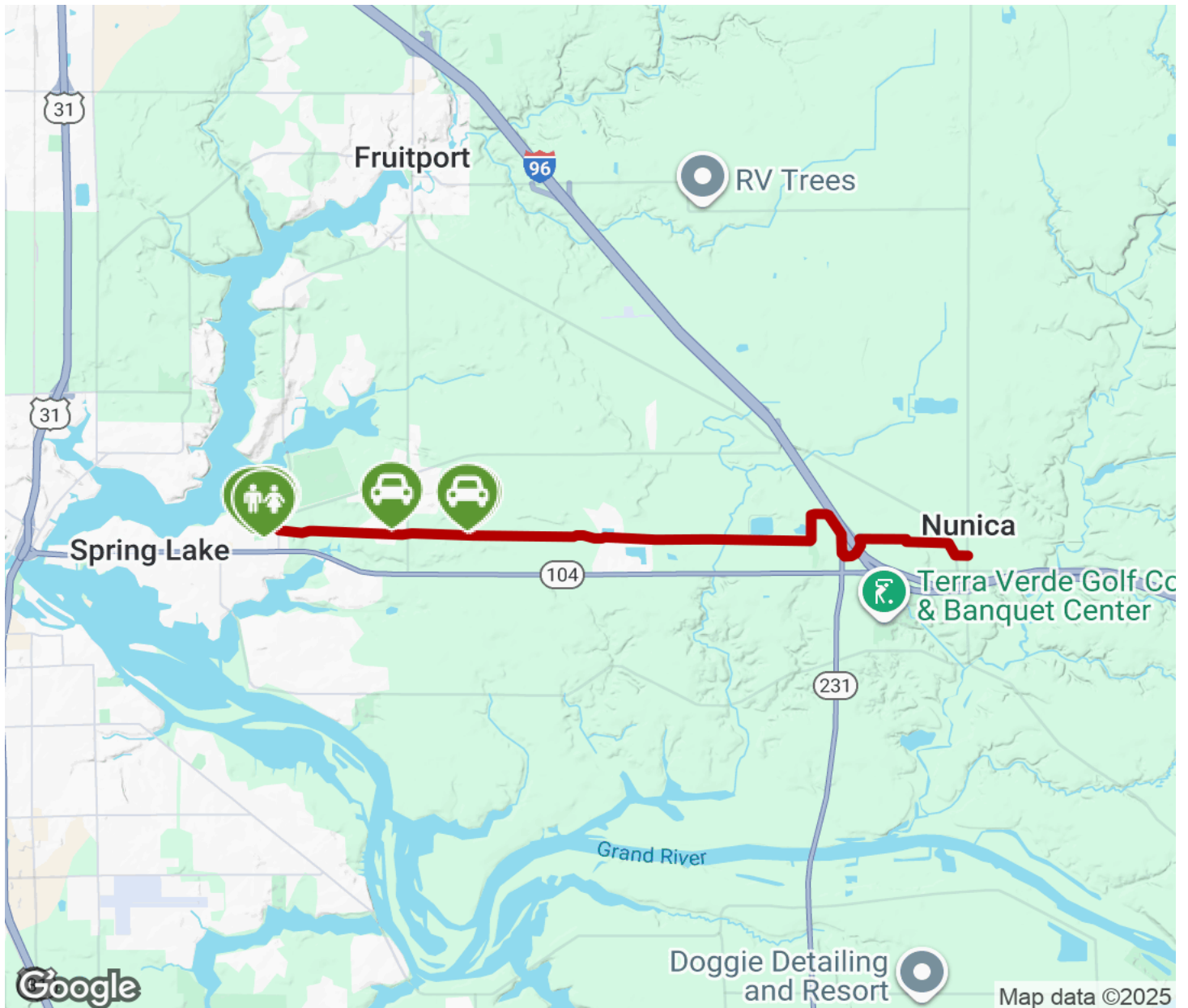
Parking & Trail Access
