It connects the villages of Pascoag and Harrisville through a corridor that once belonged to the York, New Haven, and Hartford Railroad. The paved path offers a pleasant journey through forest and wetlands, as well as a safe alternative to Route 107 for pedestrians and bicyclists. Mid-way, a spur heads south to Duck Pond.


Parking & Trail Access
