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Southwest Connector Trail (Atlanta BeltLine) Georgia



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The Southwest Connector Trail is part of the <u>Atlanta</u> <u>BeltLine</u>, a 33-mile network of paved trails throughout the city. Although currently disconnected from other segments of the BeltLine, this one-mile pathway will one day extend 4.5 miles to reach the network.

The trail is pleasantly wooded and connects to the <u>Lionel</u> <u>Hampton Trail</u> on its western end. The trail pops out of the woods at Westwood Avenue into a residential neighborhood. Mid-way, a short spur of the trail winds down to Beecher Hills Elementary School.

The Southwest Connector and Lionel Hampton trails were developed by the PATH Foundation.
