The Copper Culture Trail provides a critical off-road connection between the 8-mile Oconto River State Trail and Copper Culture



The Copper Culture Trail provides a critical off-road connection between the 8-mile [Oconto River State Trail](#) and Copper Culture State Park in Oconto. The 40-acre park offers picnic areas and access to the Oconto River for boaters, and visitors can learn about the unique history of the Native American archaeological site at the park's museum.

The trail also connects to Oconto's quiet residential streets at its southern end, allowing trail users to travel closer to the heart of the small city. From the Oconto River State Trail, the Copper Culture Trail also extends north along US 41 for a short distance before ending at Van Hecke Avenue on both sides of the highway.


Parking & Trail Access
