Sheboygan Interurban Trail

The Sheboygan Interurban Trail follows the route of an electric railway that once ran between Milwaukee and Sheboygan from the



Sheboygan's Lakeview Park, which also provides beach access.

On its southern end, the trail seamlessly connects to the Ozaukee Interurban Trail, which continues another 30 miles to Milwaukee.

The Sheboygan Interurban Trail follows the route of an electric railway that once ran between Milwaukee and Sheboygan from the early 1900s to 1951. The trail begins at Pebble Beach Road on the Ozaukee County/Sheboygan County Line and travels north to the City of Sheboygan.

The trail's first 5.5 miles, through Cedar Grove and Oostburg, are off-road, while the remainder of the route is along low-volume roads. The off-road portion also runs adjacent to an active railroad.

A highlight of the journey is Kohler-Andrae State Park, located between Oostburg and Sheboygan. Resting on the beautiful shore of Lake Michigan, the park offers a sandy beach, nature center, hiking trails, and camping facilities. Farther north, the trail ends at the doorstep to
