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DeKalb Trace *Texas*



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DeKalb Trace offers a rustic route through northeastern Texas, not far from the state's border with Arkansas. The nearly 28 mile rail-trail stretches from Annona, east through Avery and DeKalb, and on to New Boston. Along the way, it passes through beautiful woodlands and rural landscapes. (Note that the final 12 miles between DeKalb and New Boston is an unimproved surface trail).

The route forms the eastern leg of the larger Northeast Texas Trail, which, when complete, will be the state's longest trail at more than 130 miles. Other segments of the system include: <u>Reno Rail-Trail</u>, <u>Trail de Paris</u>, and <u>Chaparral Rail Trail</u>.
