

Hinkson Creek Trail offers a beautiful, natural escape as it curves around southern and eastern Columbia. The crushed limestone trail stretches just over 4 miles, partly along the southern end of the University of Missouri campus.

The trail begins at a connection to the <u>MKT Nature and</u> <u>Fitness Trail</u> that, in turn, connects to the renowned <u>Katy</u> <u>Trail State Park</u>, which nearly traverses the state of Missouri.

Highlights of Hinkson Creek Trail include passage through Capen Park and Grindstone Nature Area, which are especially scenic, including two bridges designed with a railroad aesthetic. On its northern end, the trail finishes in Stephens Lake Park, which offers lots of recreational amenities, including open playing fields, spraygrounds, gardens, and a beach. Picnic shelters and restrooms are also available in the park.


Parking & Trail Access
