Covington Circle Trail provides a loop around Covington in northwestern Indiana, offering views of farmland, wetlands, and small wooded creeks. Some on-road sections in Covington allow users to make a complete loop around town.

A highlight of the rail-trail is a distinctive historical bridge that was donated by the Fountain County Commissioners. The Fountain County Bridge No. 63, built in 1910, spans the two branches of Mallory Branch Creek.

The route also connects several of the city's buildings and complexes, such as the Covington School Athletic Complex, Covington Citizen Center, and the USDA service center.


Parking is available at the Covington Circle Park.
