This innovative road-to-trail project opened for public use in March 2014. The trail, which features stunning Pacific Ocean views,



This innovative road-to-trail project opened for public use in March 2014. The trail, which features stunning Pacific Ocean views, makes use of a former portion of California's State Route 1, which was rerouted here through a pair of tunnels. The paved multi-use trail, located about 20 miles south of San Francisco, provides dedicated space for bicyclists, pedestrians and equestrian users. Parking is available at each end, as well as ample benches and interpretive signage.

Since this is a former roadway, the grade can be more aggressive than a traditional rail-trail, but with no motorized traffic to worry about, users can travel at a comfortable pace.

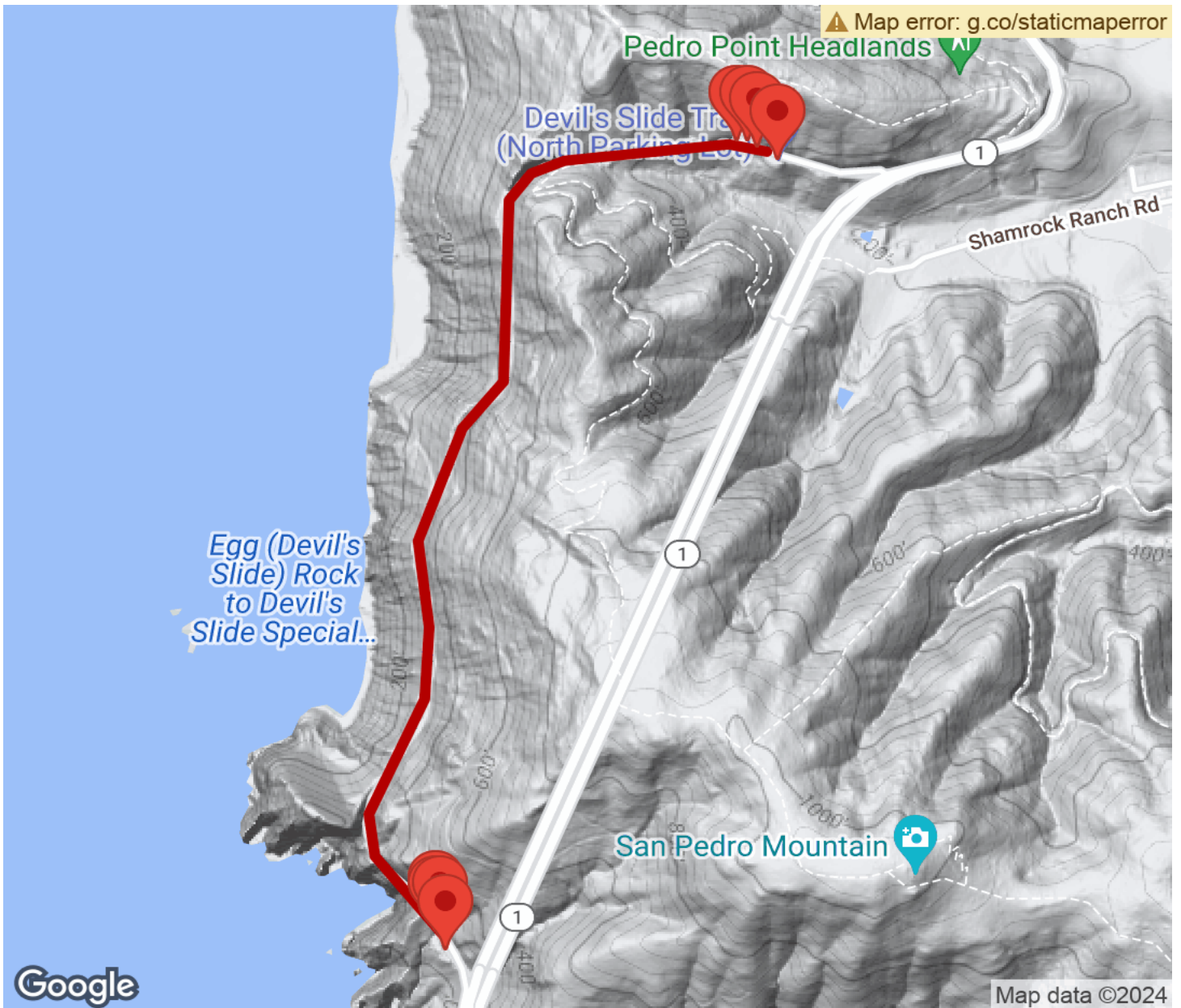
Parking & Trail Access
