Walker Park Trail

The Walker Park Trail loops around Walker Park, providing access to the various amenities within Fayetteville's second oldest park.



The Walker Park Trail loops around Walker Park, providing access to the various amenities within Fayetteville's second oldest park. Visitors can enjoy a large skate park, playgrounds, soccer fields, tennis courts, picnic areas and a remarkable mural from the early 19th century portraying the everyday life of the community at that time.

Technically, the trail on the western edge of the park is the popular <u>Frisco Trail</u>, which courses south to Town Branch and north through downtown Fayetteville, ultimately linking with other trails throughout the city. There are also breaks in the Walker Park Trail at Block Avenue and College Avenue, so trail users must use the sidewalk or street to complete the loop.
