The Rincon Multi-Use Trail offers both beautiful views of the Santa Barbara Channel and an important alternative to US 101 for



developing multi-use route spanning 1,200 miles from Oregon to Mexico.

The Rincon Multi-Use Trail offers both beautiful views of the Santa Barbara Channel and an important alternative to US 101 for bicyclists. The paved trail is 3.5 miles long.

About the Route

The northern end of the trail begins at Carpinteria State Beach's Rincon Point and Rincon County Beach Park, a popular surfing spot just outside of Carpinteria, and heads south between the coast and the highway with a decorative railing separating the trail from traffic. There are signs for the Pacific Coast Bike Route along the trail.

The northern end of the trail begins at the Santa Barbara County line but runs through Ventura County and is part of a larger network called the California Coastal Trail, a

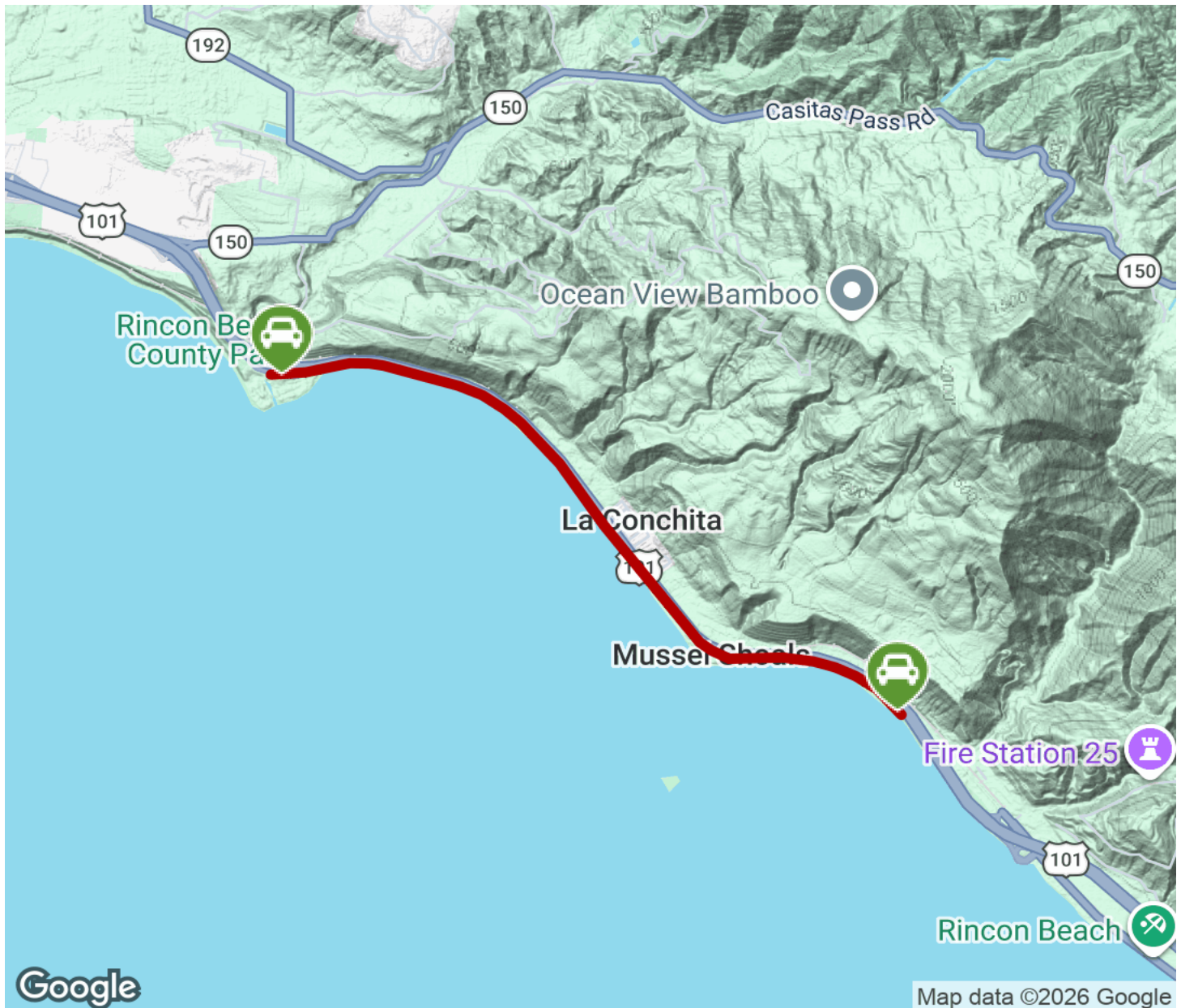
The Rincon Bike Trail runs between Rincon Point (Carpinteria) and Mobil Pier Rd (Ventura), both of which offer parking.
