

White Oak Creek Greenway

North Carolina

The White Oak Creek Greenway runs through Cary, a city in North Carolina's Triangle region that also includes Raleigh and Durham.



The White Oak Creek Greenway runs through Cary, a city in North Carolina's Triangle region that also includes Raleigh and Durham. On the west end the trail connects to the [American Tobacco Trail](#), the state's longest rail-trail, which heads 22 miles north to Durham.

The Town of Cary completed this trail in early 2020 and it now spans seven miles. It offers a paved, pleasant ride or walk through wooded areas and wetlands, providing access to several parks, including (from west to east): White Oak Park, Davis Drive Park, and Fred G. Bond Metro Park. In the latter park, the trail connects to the [Black Creek Greenway](#), which heads farther east.

All three trails are part of the East Coast Greenway, which will one day extend from Maine to Florida.


