The Dry Creek Trail is a mostly level, shady trail that follows its namesake creek in Clovis. The western trailhead connects with the [Clovis Old Town Trail](#) and has a small parking lot. The trail travels east and north, passing along Cottonwood Park, Dry Creek Park and the Clovis Botanical Gardens. Most street crossings have stoplights, and public restrooms are available in Dry Creek Park.

The eastern trailhead has plentiful parking, restrooms, a few tables and a bicycle repair station. [Enterprise Canal Trail](#) is just east of the eastern trailhead, and can be accessed by a short ride along the bank of Enterprise Canal to N. Fowler Avenue.

Parking & Trail Access

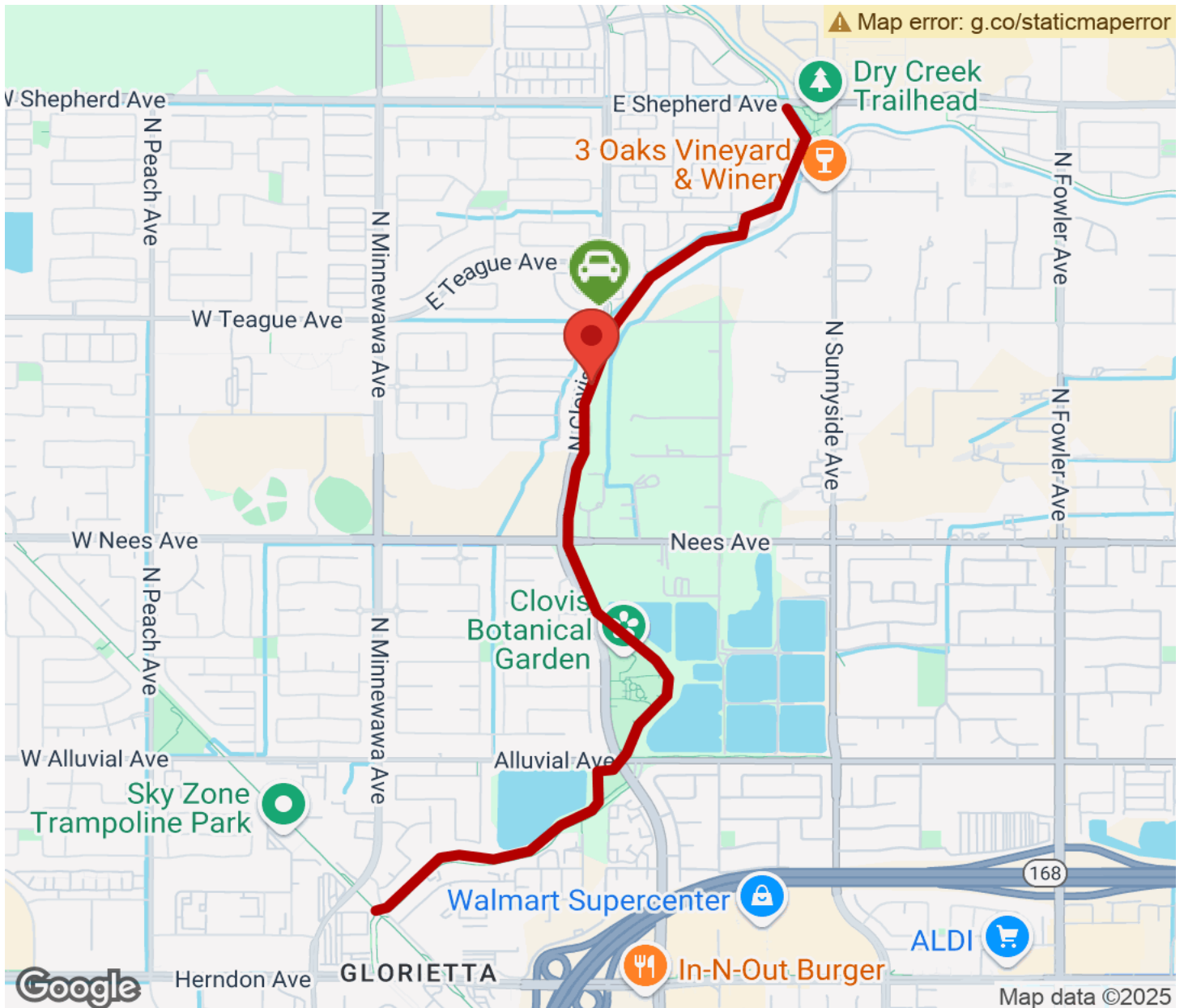
To reach the western trailhead from State Route 168, take the Herndon Avenue exit, and travel west a half mile to N. Villa Avenue. Turn north on Villa and then take the next right on Minnewawa Avenue. The parking lot is behind the fire station.

To reach the eastern trailhead from SR 168, take the Herndon Avenue exit, and travel west a half mile to N. Villa Avenue. Turn north on Villa. Villa almost immediately curves and becomes N. Minnewawa Avenue. Continue north 3 miles to Shepherd Avenue. Turn right on Shepherd and drive east 0.9 mile to the trailhead near N. Sunnyside Avenue. The address is 4999 E Shepherd Ave #4971, Clovis, CA.
