Corkscrew Rail Trail

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The first section of the Corkscrew Rail Trail opened in June 2015. It begins at Knapp Road in Stephentown and heads south under a shady tree canopy towards New Lebanon, near the New York/Massachusetts border.

The natural surface rail-trail follows the route of the Rutland Railroad, which carried freight and passengers until 1952. This section of tracks was nicknamed "The Corkscrew" because of its tight turns between hills.

Future plans call for continuing the trail north into Petersburg and the Cherry Plain State Park.

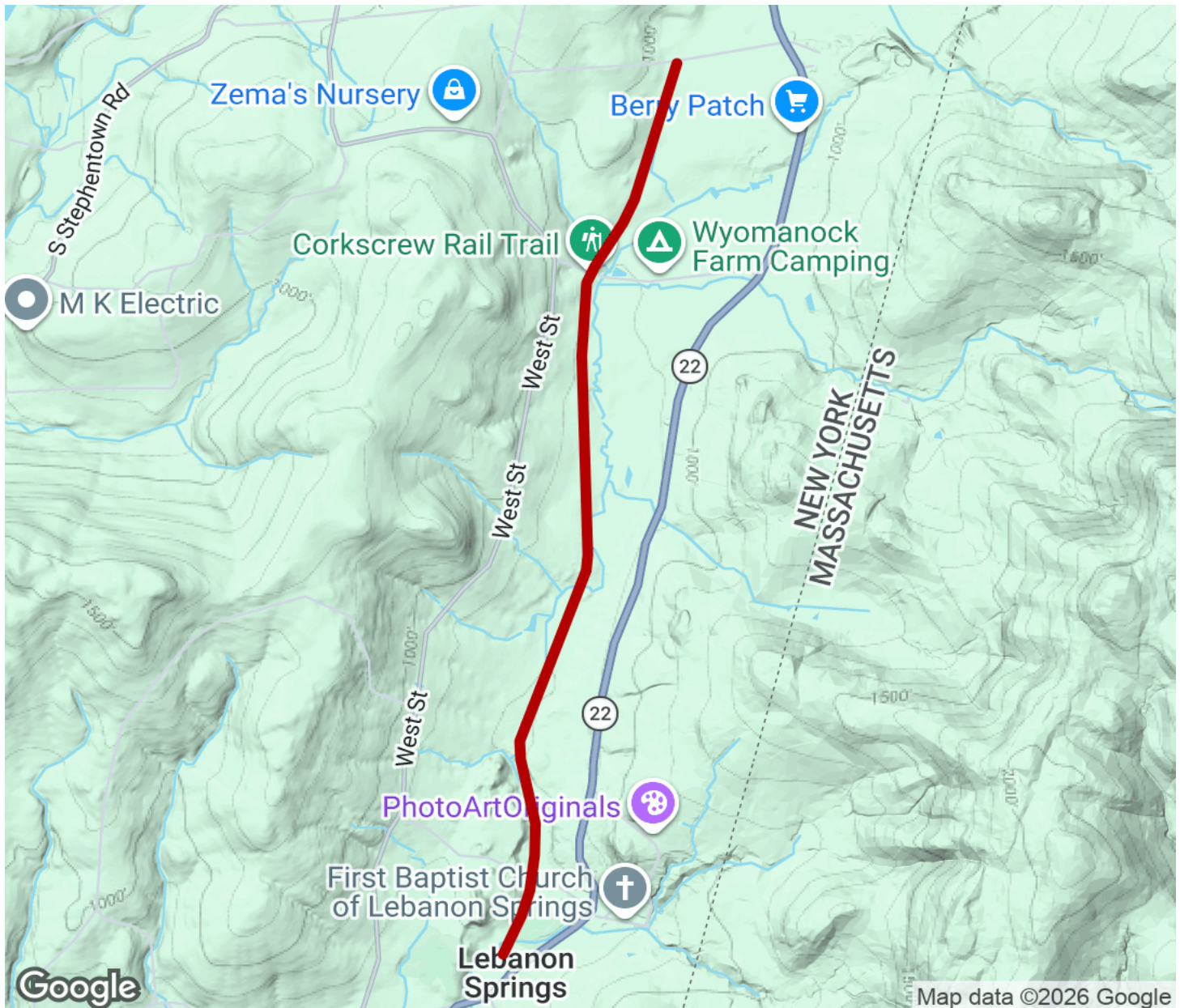
