New Springville Greenway

New York

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The New Springville Greenway stretches just over 3 miles, primarily paralleling Richmond Avenue on New York's Staten Island. A highlight of the paved pathway is its proximity to Freshkills Park, a former landfill that is being converted into open green space. The trail begins in Bulls Head and heads south to Eltingville. Along the way, you'll find a wetland overlook, benches, and bike racks.

On the north end of the trail, you can hop on an existing bike lane on Arlene Street. Near the southern end of the trail, at Richmond Avenue and Forest Hill Road, you can connect to the [Staten Island Greenbelt](#), which heads east towards LaTourette Park and spans 2.6 miles.

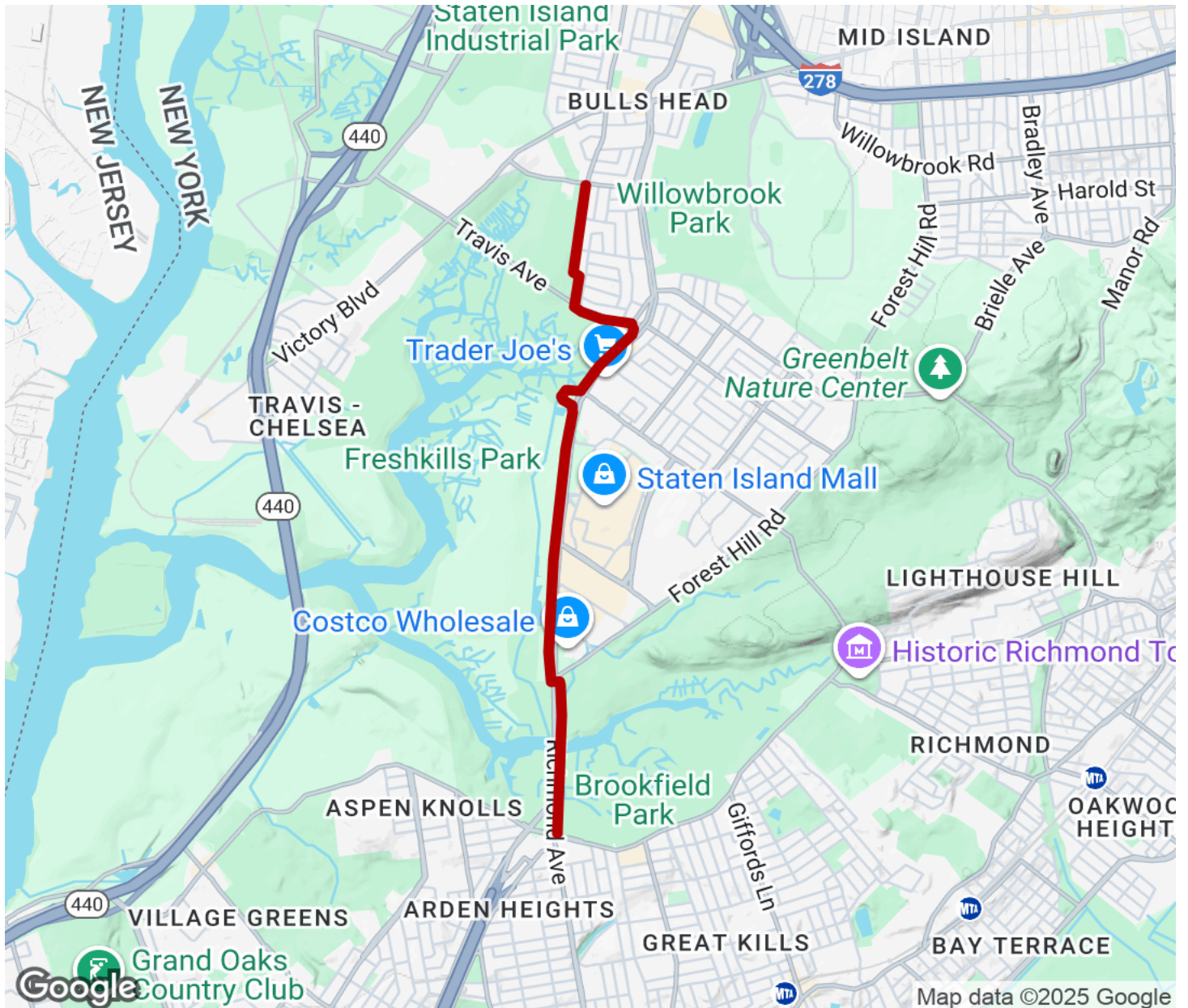
Parking & Trail Access
