Lake Springdale Trail

The Lake Springdale Trail is actually a collection of conjoining trails that encircle scenic Lake Springdale in Northwest Arkansas.



of the <u>Razorback Regional Greenway</u>, a 46-mile, primarily offroad, shared-use trail that extends from southeast Bella Vista to the southern edge of Fayetteville.

The Lake Springdale Trail is actually a collection of conjoining trails that encircle scenic Lake Springdale in Northwest Arkansas. The lake is administered as part of nearby JB Hunt Park—accessible via a connector trail—and is popular with local fishermen.

The paved trail closest to the lake's edge is restricted to pedestrian use only, but non-motorized users of all types can enjoy the winding trail just a bit farther from the lake's southern shore. This stretch also connects to two longer trails: the <a href="Spring Creek Trail">Spring Creek Trail</a> at its eastern end, which heads towards downtown Springdale, and the <a href="Silent Grove Trail">Silent Grove Trail</a> at its northwestern end, which runs to the Lowell border.

All three trails are also central components
