Gayle's Trails is a tribute to a true conservation advocate. Named after Gayle Oberst, former Mayor of Panama City Beach, due to her trail conservation work.

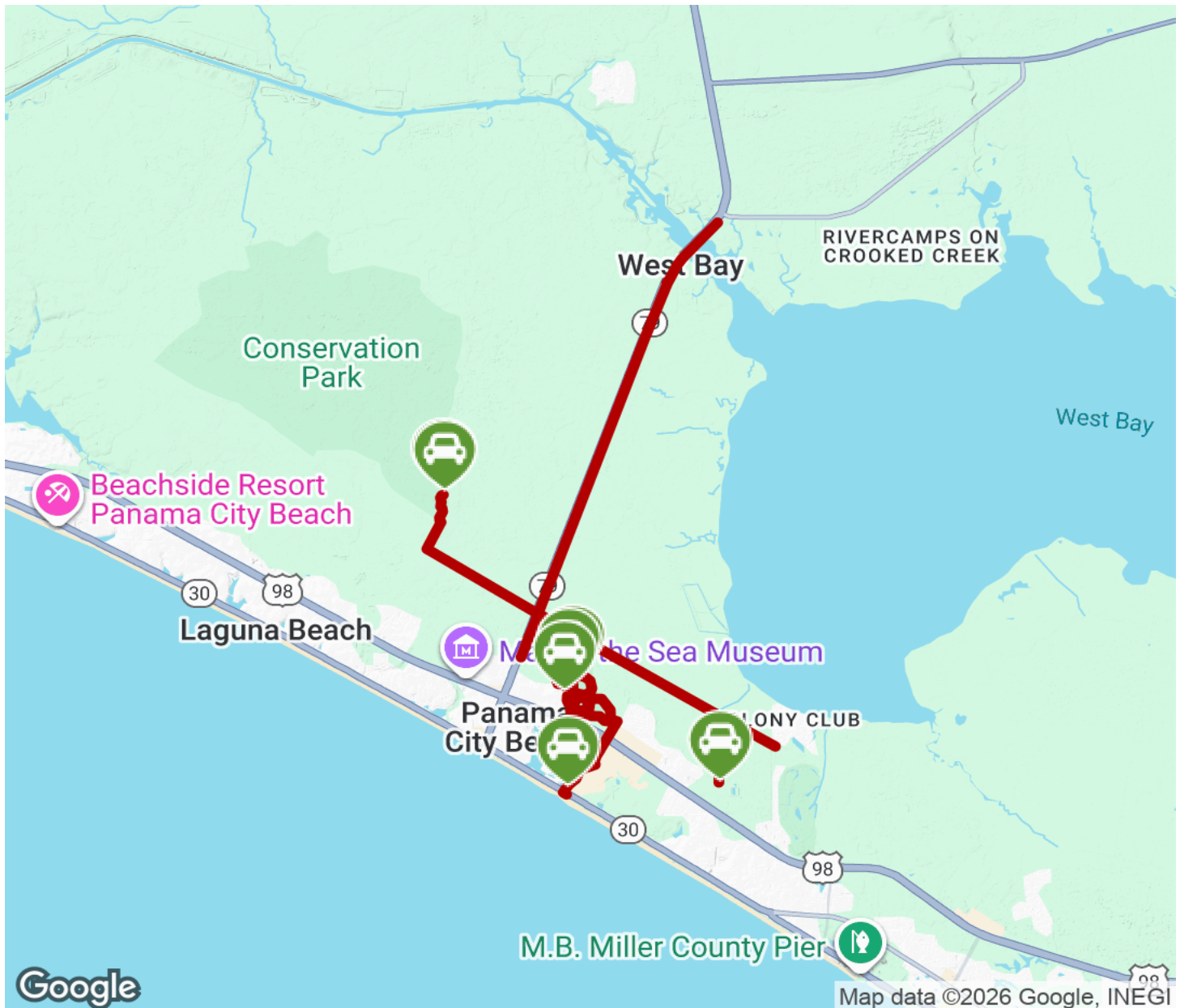
