The paved path, also known appropriately as Oceanfront Boardwalk, is technically open to cyclists and inline skaters, but speed is limited to 8 miles per hour. The boardwalk's overwhelming foot traffic makes such travel difficult anyway, so consider leaving your wheeled conveyance at home and joining the hordes on foot.

In addition to providing regular access to the popular beach throughout its route, the trail passes numerous shops, restaurants, houses, condominiums, and parks, as

## Parking & Trail Access

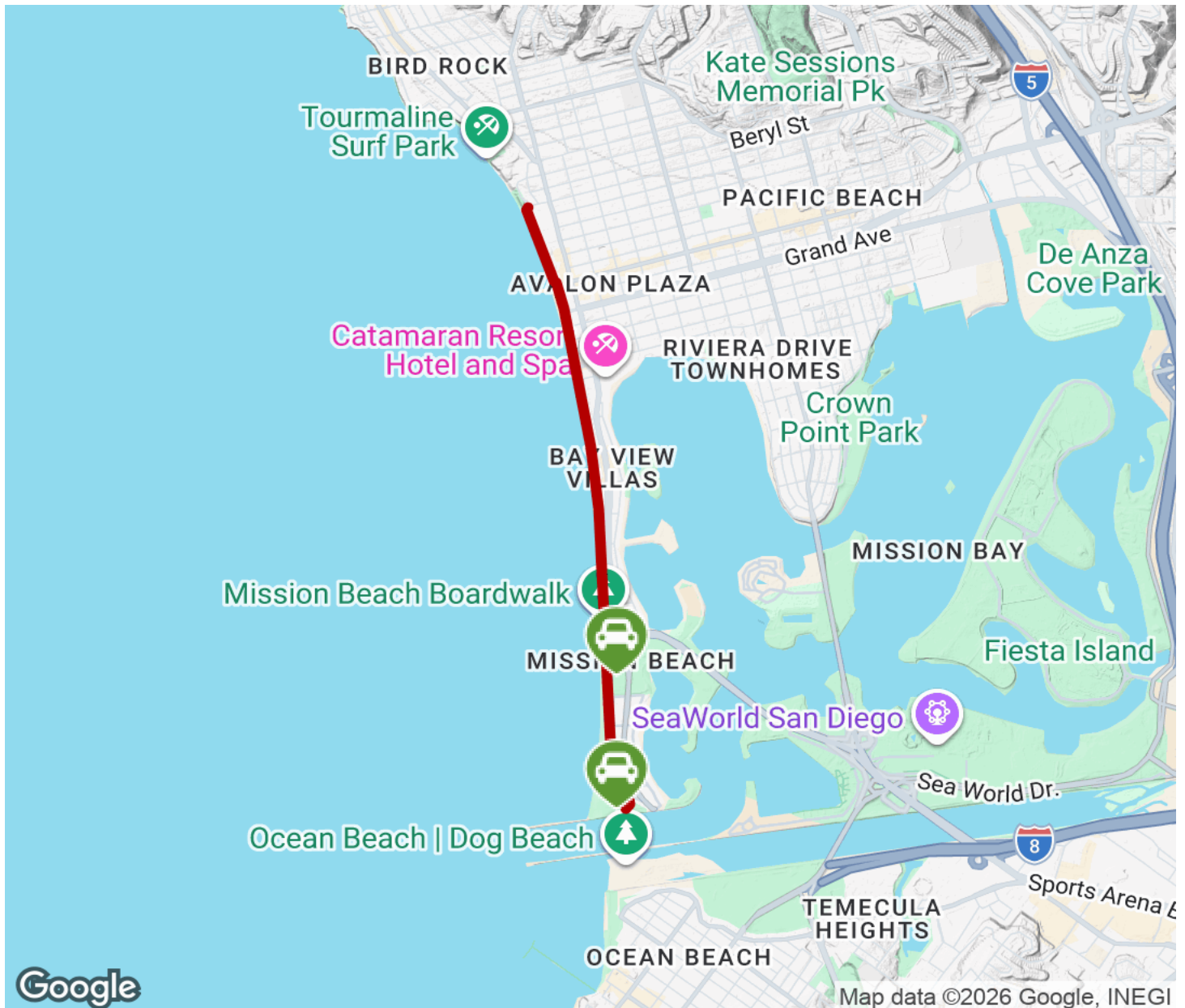
