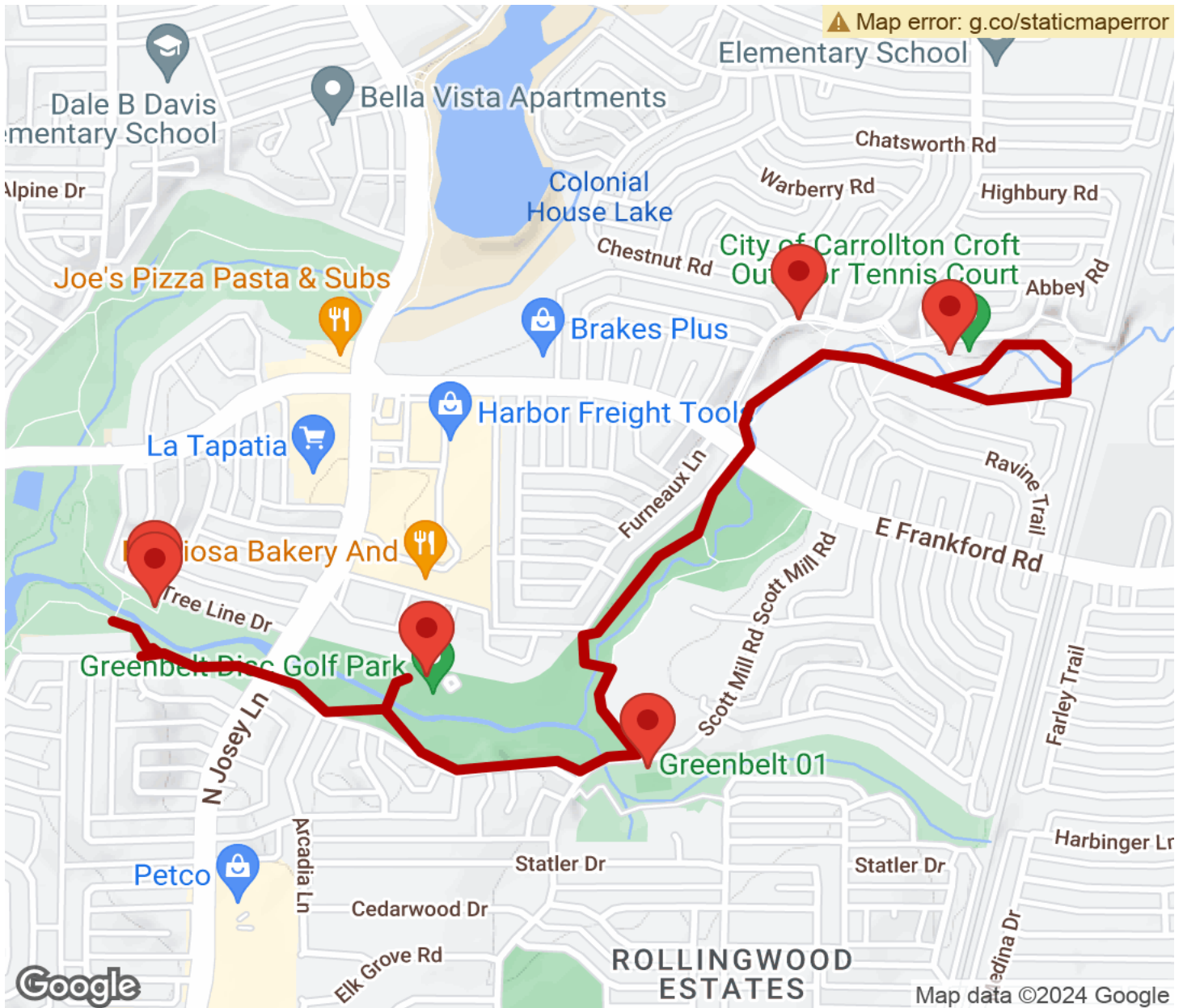
## Parking & Trail Access
