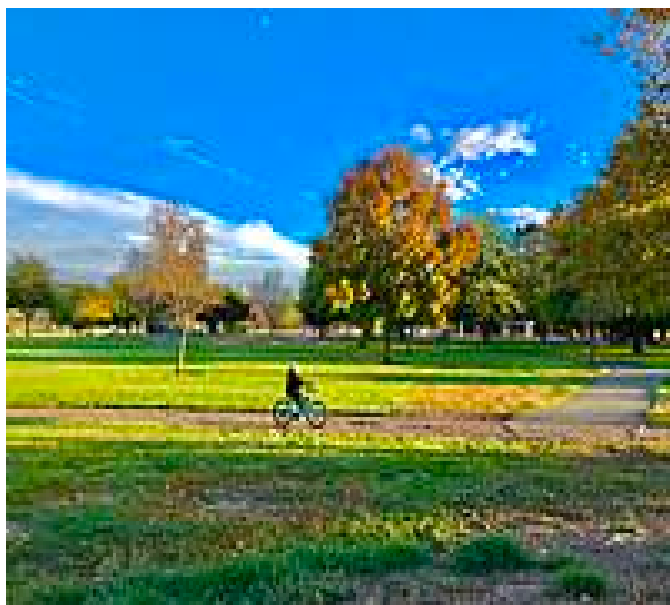

Napa River Trail

California

Overview The Napa River Trail parallels its namesake river through the City of Napa between Kennedy Park and just south of



downtown Napa, where there is access to various shops and restaurants. One unique attraction is the Napa Valley Wine Train. After a day out on the trail, you can treat yourself to some wine and fine dining aboard this railway adventure.

The northern segment follows the river's west bank from Lincoln Avenue to Trancas Street. On one side of the route you will find quiet residential neighborhoods and, on the other side, is the wooded Napa River.

Overview

The Napa River Trail parallels its namesake river through the City of Napa between Kennedy Park and just south of Trancas Crossing Park. It is currently open in two disconnected segments totaling 4.3 miles.

About the Route

The southern segment, which follows the east bank of the river from Kennedy Park to just shy of 3rd Street, shares the route with the Napa Valley Vine Trail. Kennedy Park is nestled against the Napa River and has something for the entire family to enjoy. Not only is there a playground for the kids, but numerous outdoor recreational activities including a golf course and picnic tables. It ends near

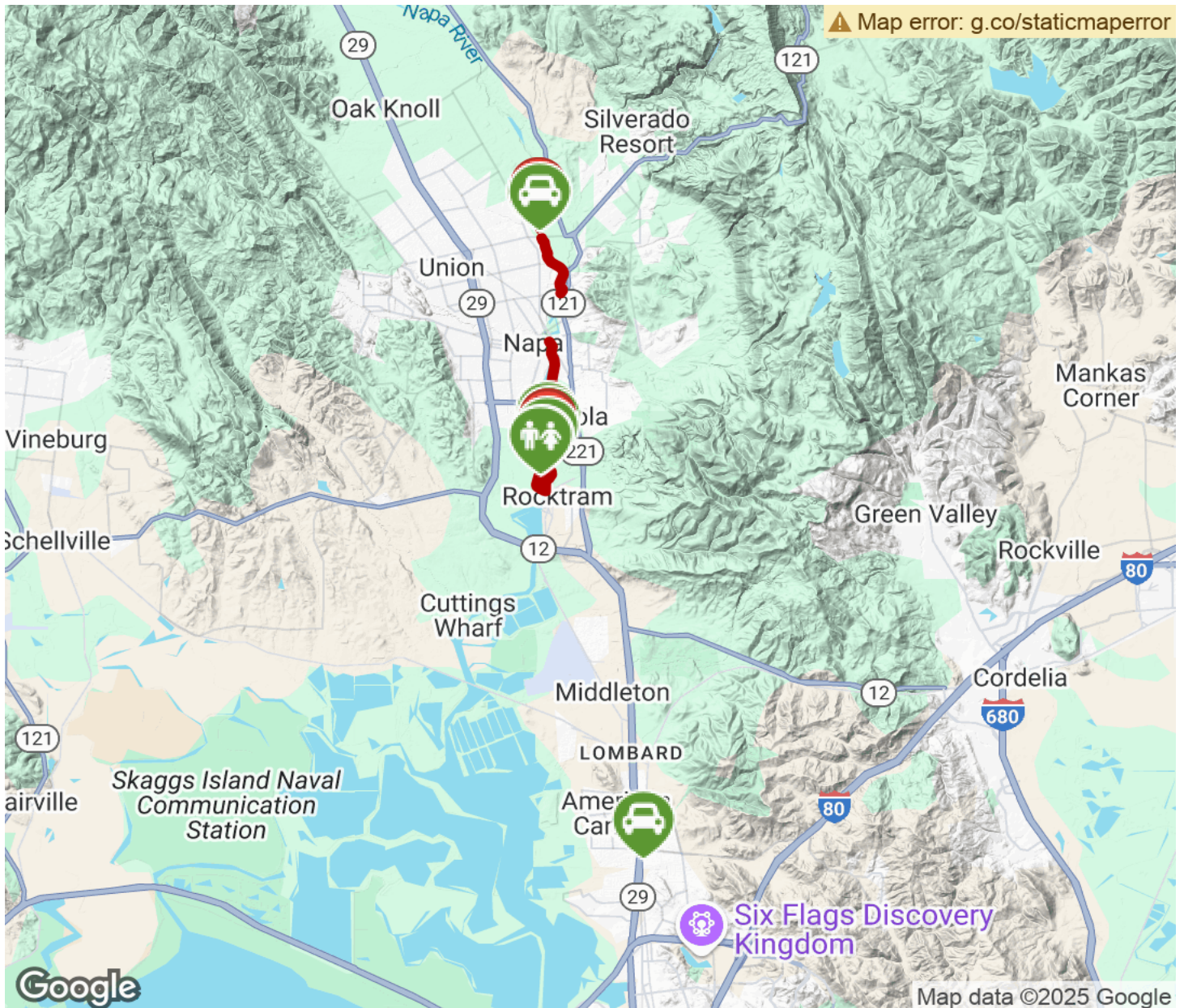
The Napa River Trail runs between Trancas St (Napa) and Kennedy Park, 3291 Streblow Dr (Napa), where parking is available.
