Aspen Mass Trail

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The Aspen Mass Trail connects two communities—Aspen and Snowmass Village—in the Roaring Fork Valley. Although not very long, the paved trail offers a key connection between two trails. At its northern end is the 42-mile [Rio Grande Trail](#) that heads up to Glenwood Springs, and at its southern end is the [Brush Creek Trail](#) that winds its way to the restaurants, shops, and attractions of Snowmass Village.

At the trail's north end, you'll also find Jaffee Park. With its locale on the banks of the Roaring Fork River, the park is popular with fishermen, rafters, and kayakers, as well as a nice spot to picnic.

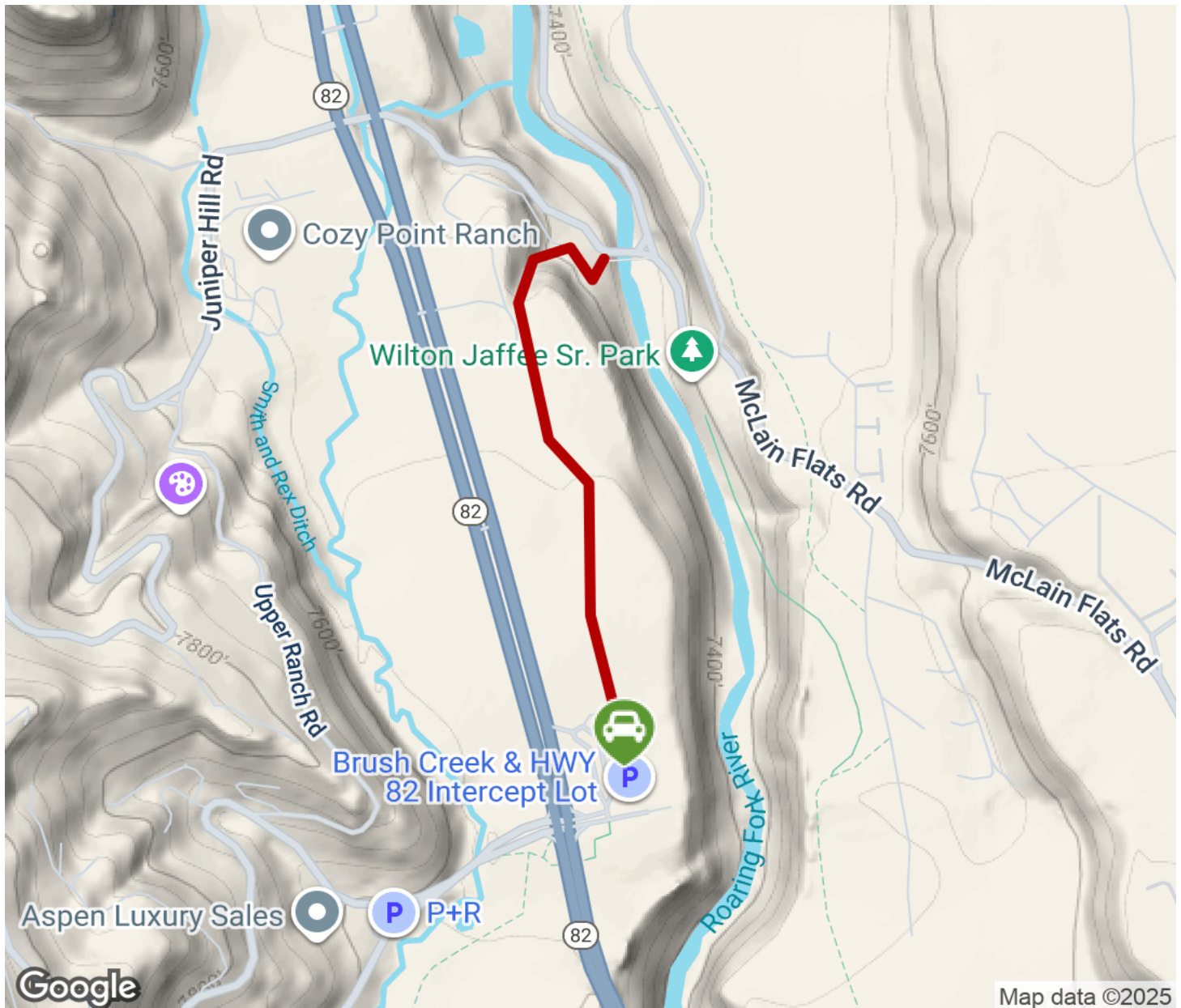
Parking & Trail Access
