The gravel and boardwalk path runs through a restored wetlands area on the outskirts of town, giving residents the chance to experience some of the scenic beauty that its namesake creek has to offer, and also providing a place for students at the nearby elementary school to learn about nature in action. While only a small segment of trail currently exists, the local trail group Valley County Pathways has ambitious plans for the area, including utilizing the abandoned rail corridor that runs through Donnelly.

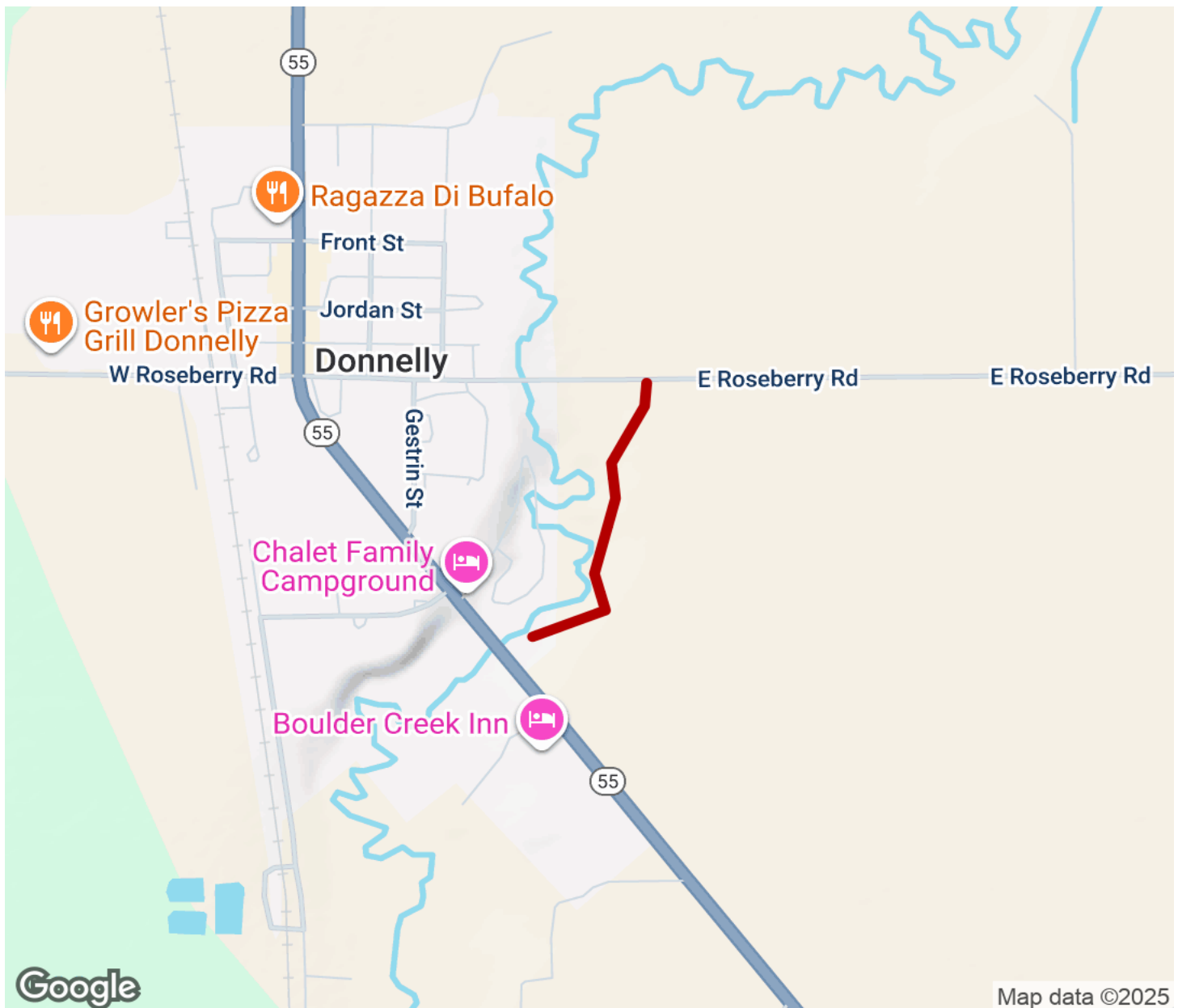
