The trail begins at the southern end of the [Walnut Creek Trail](#), and follows the creek into Ashworth Park, a wooded retreat in the city. Cyclists, walkers and users of all types will enjoy the sun-dappled pathway. A rustic trestle bridge carries trail users across Raccoon River, before it connects to the [Meredith Trail](#).

The trail was named for a member of the Des Moines Park Board who played a significant role to raise funds for the city's trail system.

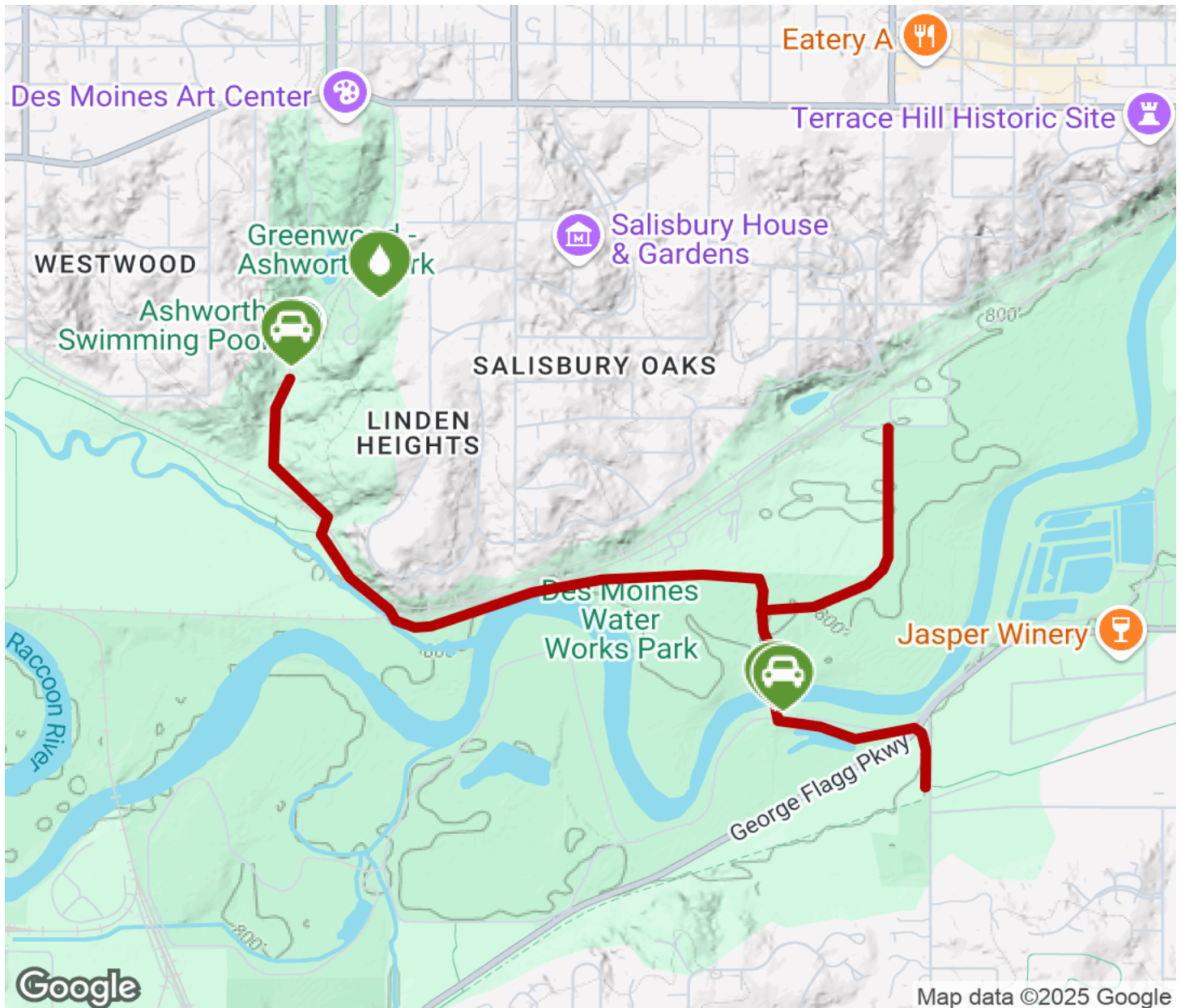
