## Thomas Township Trail

*The Thomas Township Trail provides a 3-mile paved, north-south route through this Michigan community. Running along a power*



are a number of important buildings, including the police and fire departments, public library, and municipal offices. Following the power line right-of-way for another three-quarters of a mile, the trail comes to an end at North Miller Road.

The Thomas Township Trail provides a 3-mile paved, north-south route through this Michigan community. Running along a power line corridor, the route offers a mix of wooded patches, open farm fields, and residential neighborhoods.

The trail begins at a connection with the popular [Saginaw Valley Rail Trail](#), which heads southwest to St. Charles and east towards Saginaw. From that juncture, the Thomas Township Trail heads north, past Swan Valley High School, and crosses busy Gratiot Road, which is bordered by stores and restaurants.

The trail continues north and crosses Shields Drive, where it has a pavilion with picnic tables, a seasonal water fountain, and restrooms. Within two blocks east of here

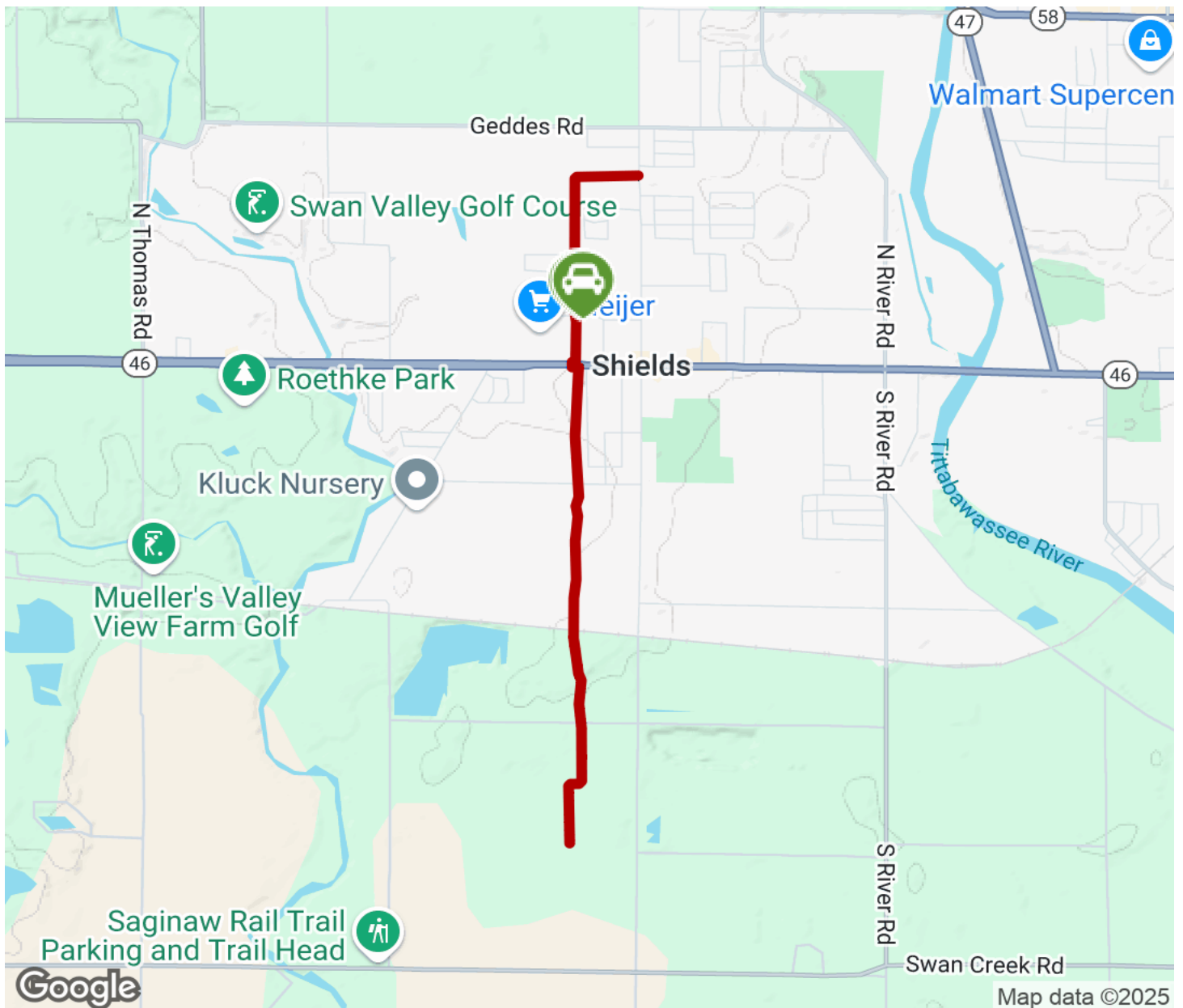
