Padilla Bay Shore Trail

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The Padilla Bay Shore Trail offers a gravel route of just over 2 miles atop a dike along the Padilla Bay in Northwest Washington. Adventurers will enjoy the scenic natural setting only about 70 miles north of Seattle in the community of Bay View.

As the area is a national marine estuary, you may see peregrine falcons, snowy owls, blue herons, and many other types of birds along the trail. A viewing platform makes for a pleasant rest stop and a spiral staircase takes you down to the beach. Opposite the bay, travelers will also see picturesque rural landscapes.

The trail is just south of the 25-acre Bay View State Park, where you'll find camping sites and a public boat launch.

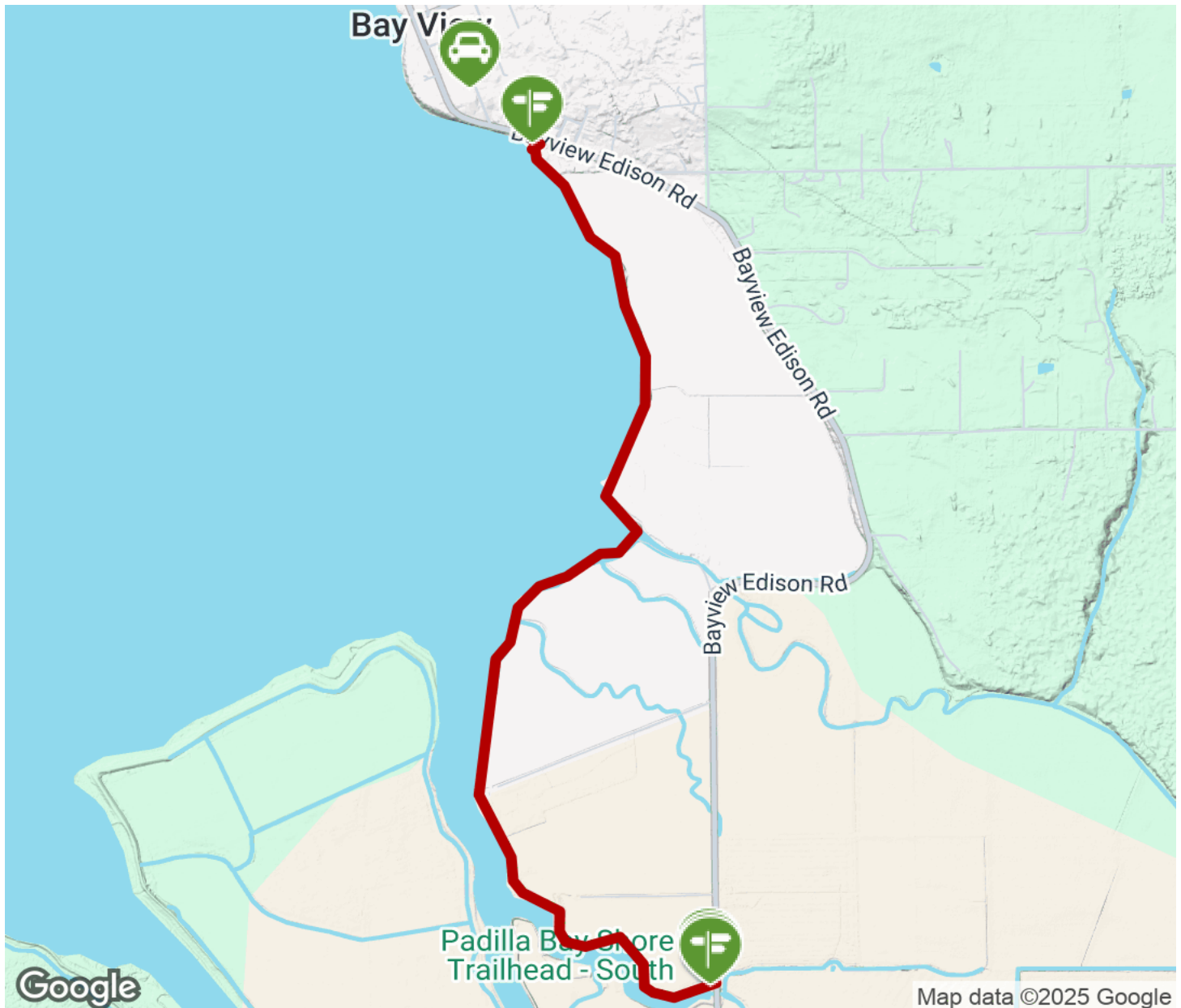
Parking & Trail Access
