The Northerly Island Trail offers access to a vast, natural oasis in one of the largest cities in America. Chicago's Northerly Island—actually a 91-acre peninsula—was designed by Daniel H. Burnham, the architect of the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. Formerly Meigs Field airport, this park-like setting is now home to a world-class music venue, sculpture installations, bike and foot paths, and some postcard-worthy views of the Chicago skyline.

The paved pathway winds along Lake Michigan, Burnham Harbor, and Daphne's Garden, which offers unique public

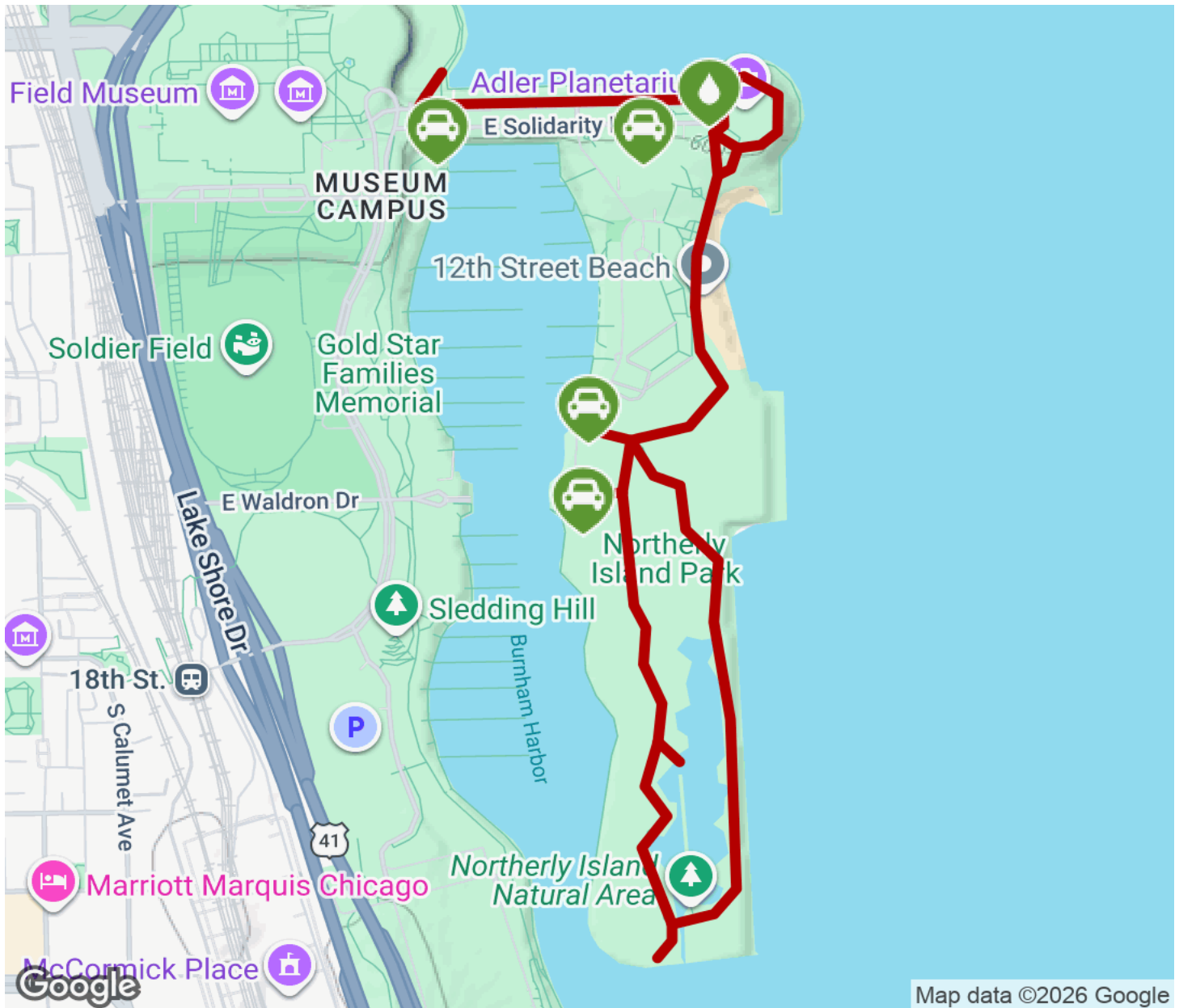
Parking & Trail Access
