The Cushing Park Road Recreational Trail begins on the western outskirts of Delafield, a small community about 30 miles west of Milwaukee. From Delafield's Main Street, the trail heads south, paralleling Cushing Park Road but separated from the roadway by a comfortable margin. The paved pathway crosses the Lapham Peak Unit of the Kettle Moraine State Forest and traverses prairie landscapes.

Spanning 3 miles, the route is not especially long, but it is an important connector in the regional trail network as it connects to the <u>Lake County Recreation Trail</u> on its north end and the the <u>Glacial Drumlin State Trail</u> at its southern end. Hikers will also enjoy the pathway's connection to the Ice Age Trail.
