The Cushing Park Road Recreational Trail begins on the western outskirts of Delafield, a small community about 30 miles west of



The Cushing Park Road Recreational Trail begins on the western outskirts of Delafield, a small community about 30 miles west of Milwaukee. From Delafield's Main Street, the trail heads south, paralleling Cushing Park Road but separated from the roadway by a comfortable margin. The paved pathway crosses the Lapham Peak Unit of the Kettle Moraine State Forest and traverses prairie landscapes. The trail is also part of the Route of the Badger, a Milwaukee-area trail network.

Spanning 3 miles, the route is not especially long, but it is an important connector in the regional trail network as it connects to the [Lake County Recreation Trail](#) on its north end and the [Glacial Drumlin State Trail](#) at its southern end. Hikers will also enjoy the pathway's connection to the Ice Age Trail.


Parking & Trail Access
