The Grissom Parkway Trail is a designated multipurpose path in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. The Parkway was named in honor of Bob Grissom, three-time mayor of Myrtle Beach who passed away in 1998. The paved trail mostly parallels the parkway, providing a connection for walkers, bikers and other non-motorized travelers to various neighborhood, business centers, schools and open spaces. The Grissom Parkway trail ends just after 48th Avenue. Perrin's Path becomes the new name of the greenway, stretching another 1.2 miles along the Parkway and Frontage Road up to 62nd Avenue. There is also a [multiuse path](#) along Harrelson Boulevard.

The Grissom Parkway Trail is part of the 3000-mile East Coast Greenway system.


Parking & Trail Access
