### Klingle Valley Trail

On its eastern end, near Porter Street NW, trail users can connect to the city's <u>Rock Creek Park Trails</u> and <u>Beach Drive</u>.

The Klingle Valley Trail spans just shy of a mile in a leafy, residential area of northwest Washington, DC. The trail opened in June 2017 and is accessible to the neighborhoods of Cleveland Park, Woodley Park, and Mount Pleasant.

#### About the Route

The paved pathway follows a small brook and traces the route of a former roadway, Klingle Road. From Klingle Rd. NW, the trail heads downhill alongside the Tregaron Conservancy. A highlight of the route is when the trail passes underneath Connecticut Ave. NW underneath a huge arched bridge.
