The Klinge Valley Trail spans just shy of a mile in a leafy, residential area of northwest Washington, DC. The trail opened in June 2017 and is accessible to the neighborhoods of Cleveland Park, Woodley Park, and Mount Pleasant.

About the Route

The paved pathway follows a small brook and traces the route of a former roadway, Klinge Road. From Klinge Rd. NW, the trail heads downhill alongside the Tregaron Conservancy. A highlight of the route is when the trail passes underneath Connecticut Ave. NW underneath a huge arched bridge.

The Klinge Valley Trail runs between Klinge Rd. NW (Cleveland Park) and Porter St. NW (Rock Creek Park).

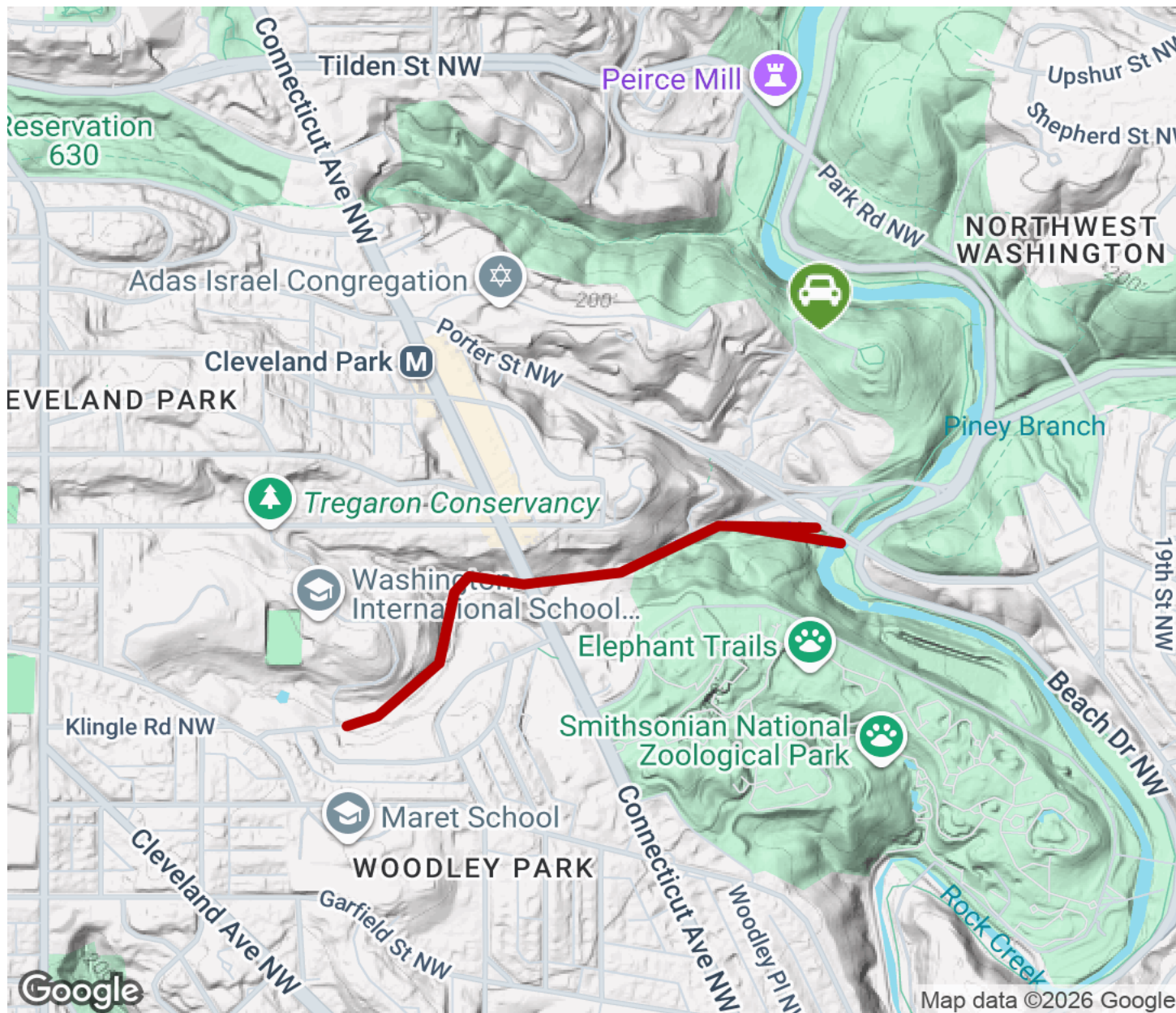
There is no designated parking for this trail. The best way to access the trail is via WMATA's bus and metro system.
