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## **Delaware River Trail** *Pennsylvania*



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The Delaware River Trail hugs the Philadelphia waterfront providing access to parks and recreational amenities. It's part of a larger effort called The Circuit, which will link 750 miles of trail throughout Greater Philadelphia.

About the Route

The northern short section of the trail leaves off from Richmond St. and E Lehigh Ave. and heads south to the intersection of Spring Garden Street and Delaware Avenue

The trail is comprised of two disconnected sections with



the larger of the two leaving off in the south from the Pier 70 and heading north to Ben Franklin Bridge near the Penn's Landing Dog Park. This section of the trail loosely parallels Christopher Columbus Boulevard. Many of the piers along the way have restaurants and other fun attractions.

A highlight is the Spruce Street Harbor Park in Penn's Landing, which has a lively atmosphere and entertainment options in the summer. The Independence Seaport Museum is also accessible from the trail and offers interactive exhibits about American shipbuilding and the development of the U.S. Navy.

Connections

The Delaware River Trail connects with the Ulysses Wiggins Waterfront Promenade.

The trail is also part of the developing Circuit Trails network.

The Delaware River Trail runs between Richmond St. (Philadelphia) and Pier 70 Blvd. (Philadelphia), where parking is available. There is a brief gap in the middle of the trail.


Parking is also available at:
