Apache Creek Greenway serves as an important connector through San Antonio's Westside neighborhoods. Beginning at a connection with the <u>San</u> <u>Pedro Creek Greenway</u>, the paved pathway meanders north and west away from the South Pan Am Expressway (I-35) and into community neighborhoods and parks along both sides of Apache Creek.

A popular attraction along the trail is Cassiano Park, where you'll find a swimming pool, playgrounds, picnic tables, and other amenities. On the trail's western leg, you'll also have nice views of Elmendorf Lake and Zarzamora Creek before the pathway ends in a commercial area along N. General McMullen Drive.

Note that the trail provides little tree cover, so you may



wish wear sunglasses and sunscreen if heading out in sunny weather.
