The New Bedford Covewalk, like the [HarborWalk](#) further east, sits atop the hurricane barrier built to protect New Bedford residents from storm surges during extreme weather. Even when it's nice out though, residents from the neighborhoods close-by have reasons to be thankful for the levee, thanks to this recreational pathway that offers panoramic views of Clark's Cove. The CoveWalk is well-lit at night and perfect for a night-time stroll or run. It stretches between Cove Road & Rodney French Boulevard.

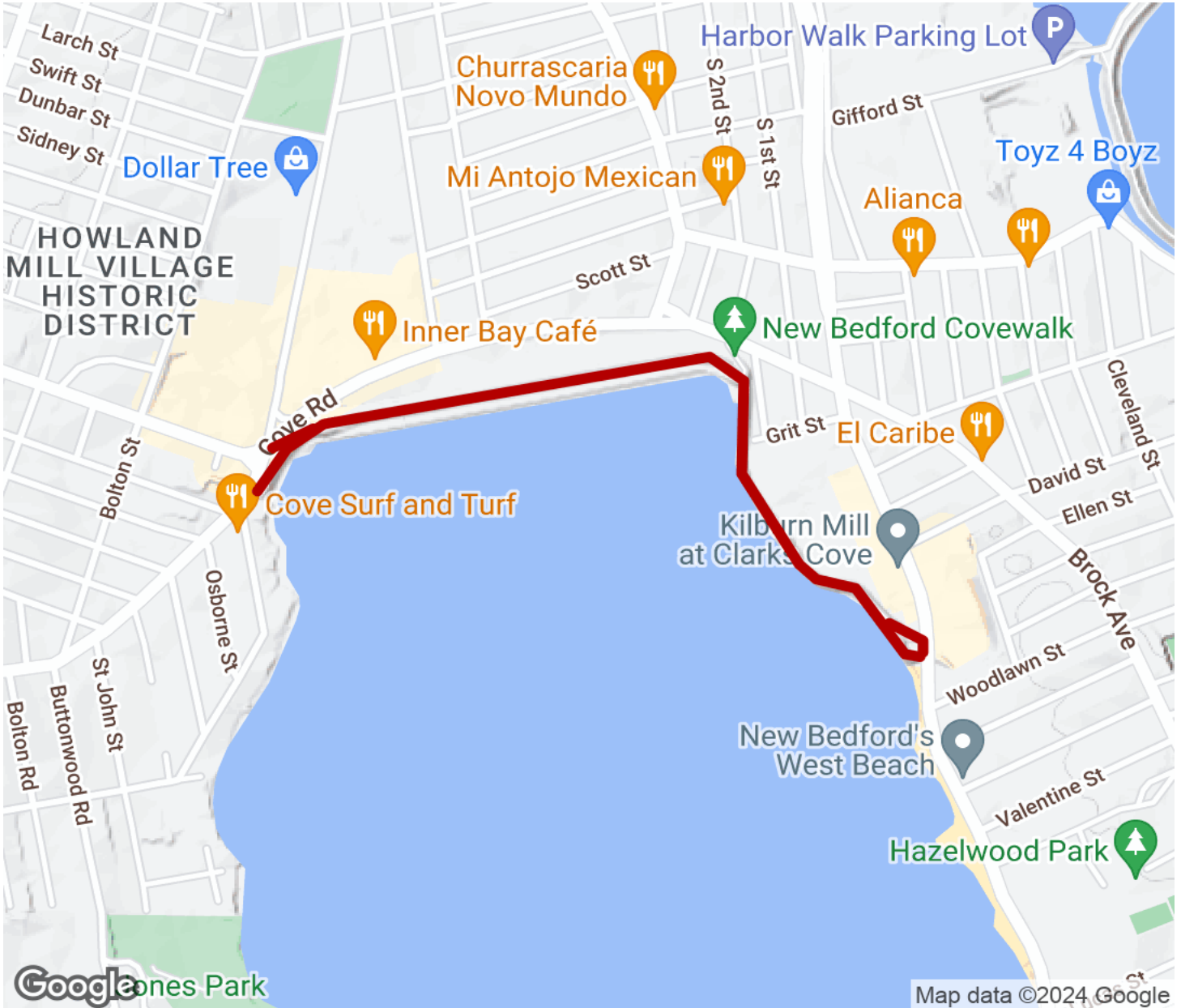
Parking & Trail Access
