Ladera Dam Trail

New Mexico



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The Ladera Dam Trail runs for nearly a mile and a half along the side of Ladera Drive in western Albuquerque, offering a pleasant sidepath that only requires a couple of road crossings along the route, running on the western side of the road that borders a large golf course. The trail's northern end connects to the short but lovely [Atrisco Trail](#), which leads up into the Quaker Heights neighborhood. With its wide asphalt surface and relatively uninterrupted corridor, the Ladera Dam Trail makes a fine addition to the area's excellent network of multi-use trails.

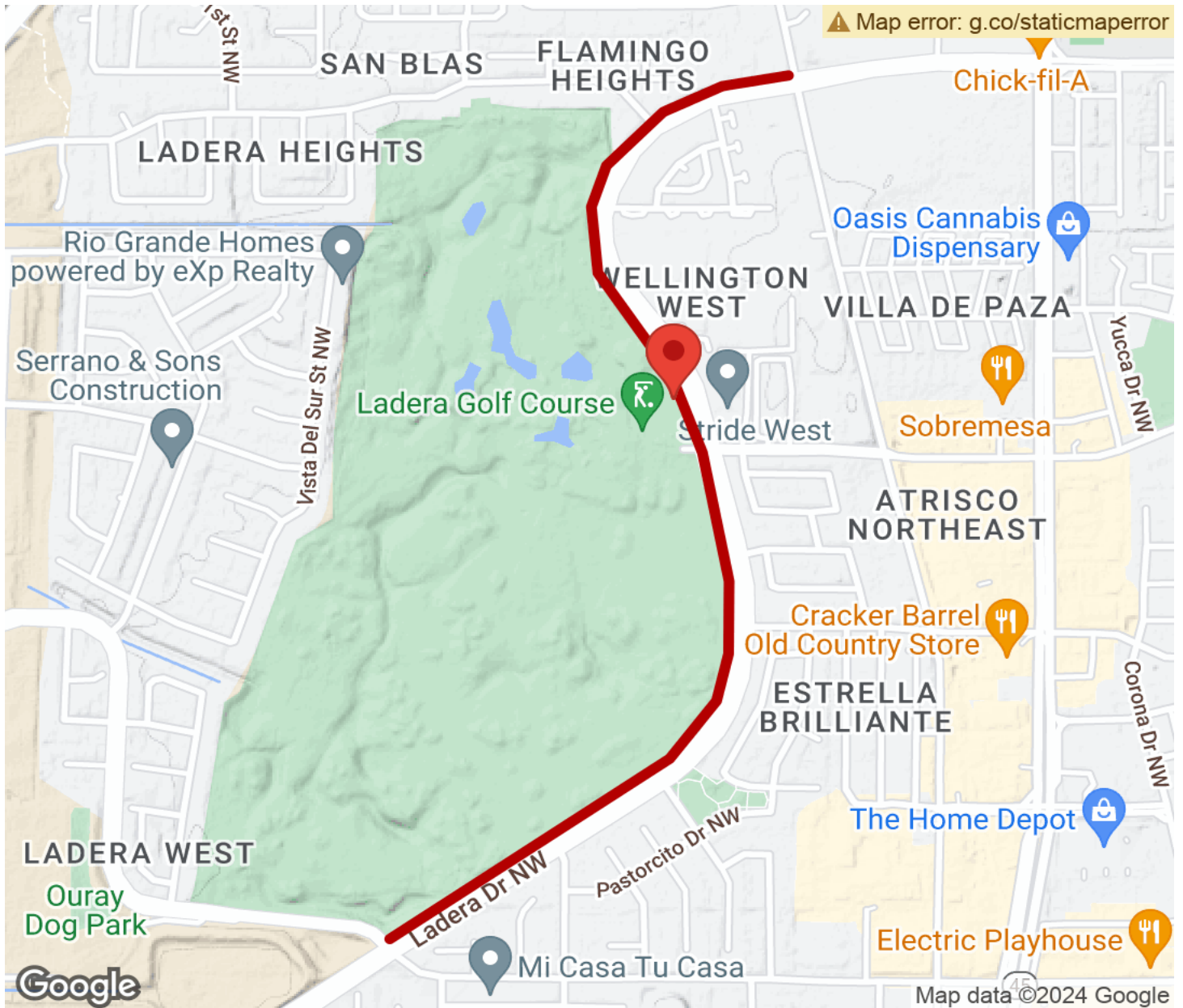
Parking & Trail Access
