The Cato Springs Trail is the most recent addition (2018) to Fayetteville's collection of paved shared-use trails. The trail forms an important bike-pedestrian link between the regional [Razorback Greenway](#) and Kessler Mountain Regional Park. The paved trail begins at Greathouse Park, at the [Town Branch Trail \(Fayetteville\)](#) intersection, and then heads south in the alongside the Cato Springs Branch. The concrete trail passes underneath a railroad bridge, then crosses Razorback Road via an underpass. It then begins to parallel Razorback Road, crossing over Fulbright Expressway and under Interstate 49. Southwest of I-49, the trail diverges from the road and weaves its way down to Kessler Mountain Regional Park.

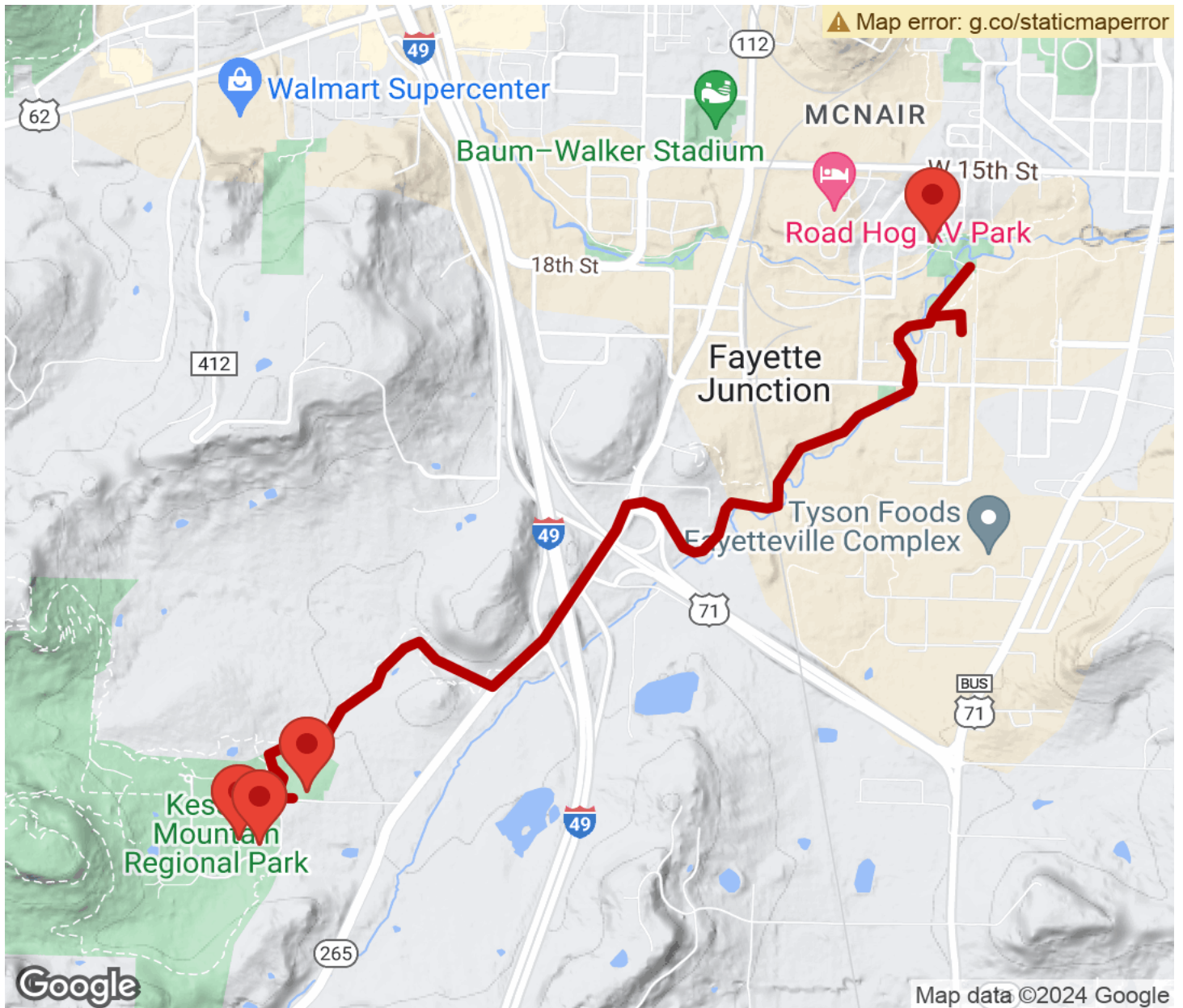
Parking & Trail Access
