The West Shore Trail sits on the former West Shore Railroad corridor, whose tracks and ties were pulled up in the 1960s. Aside from about 1300 ft in Churchville which is paved, the trail surface is crushed stone. Cutting through wetlands and fields, the trail occasionally passes through thickly wooded areas.

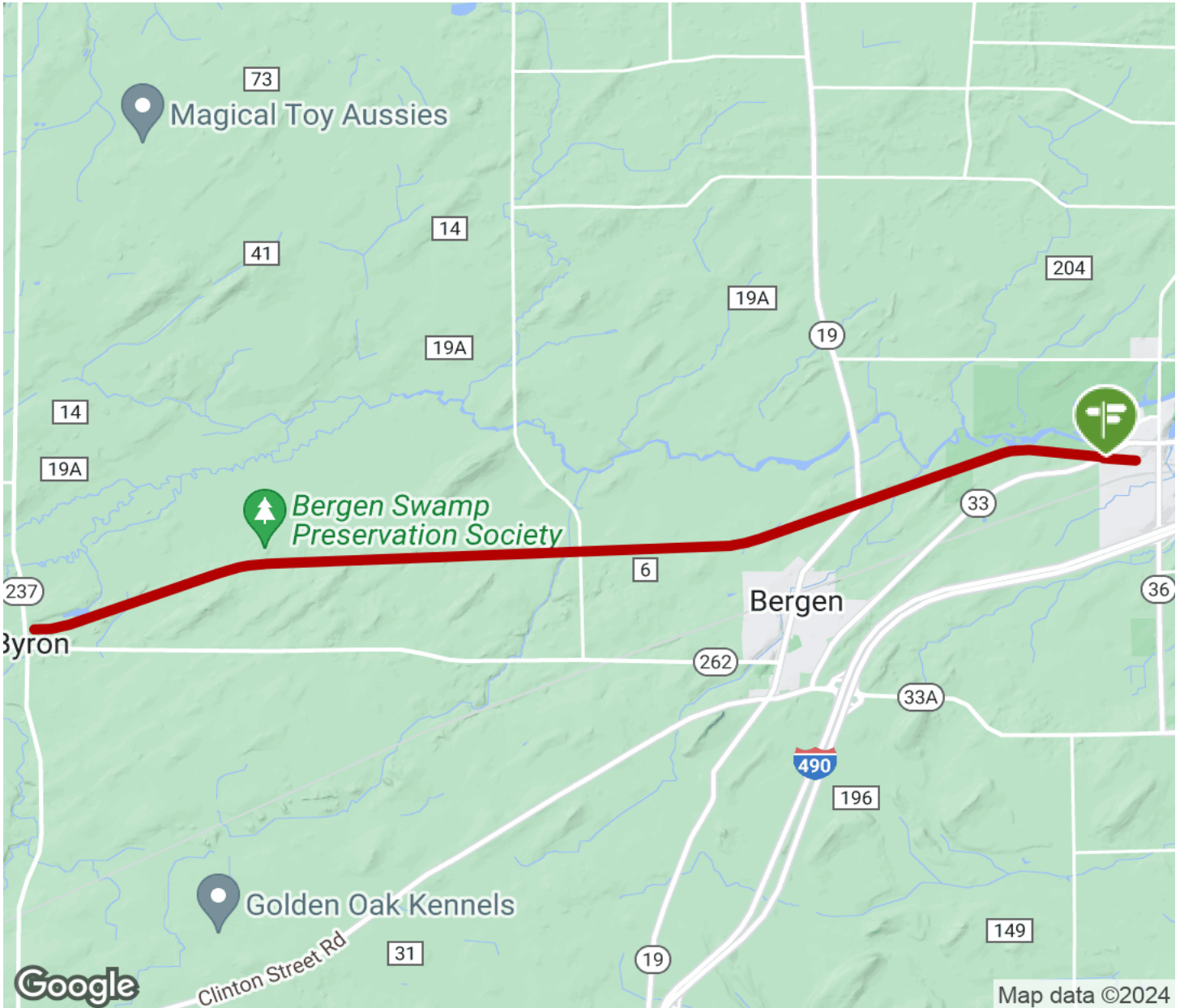
Parking & Trail Access

There is a trailhead in Churchville, at approximately 84 Buffalo Street. It features a small parking lot, a kiosk with information about the rail and trail history, benches, restrooms and water fountains. This is at the west end of the paved portion of the trail, and the beginning of the crushed stone.
