The DeKalb County Trail was constructed in 1976 and is referred to as Indiana's first rail-trail. It runs between the City of Auburn and



of Rieke Park (1800 Indiana Ave, Auburn).

The DeKalb County Trail was constructed in 1976 and is referred to as Indiana's first rail-trail. It runs between the City of Auburn and the Town of Waterloo.

At its southern end, the trail starts by Greenhurst Commons (1740 N Main St, Auburn), an urban preserve that is home to a variety of wildlife, a pond, and 1.25 miles of paved, accessible trails.

From Greenhurst Commons, the trail runs along the east side of Main Street and then Wayne Street/County Road 427 to the southern limits of Waterloo through farmland and the occasional private residence.

Also known as the Auburn/Waterloo Bike Path, the trail runs parallel to [Rieke Trail](#), which runs along the east side

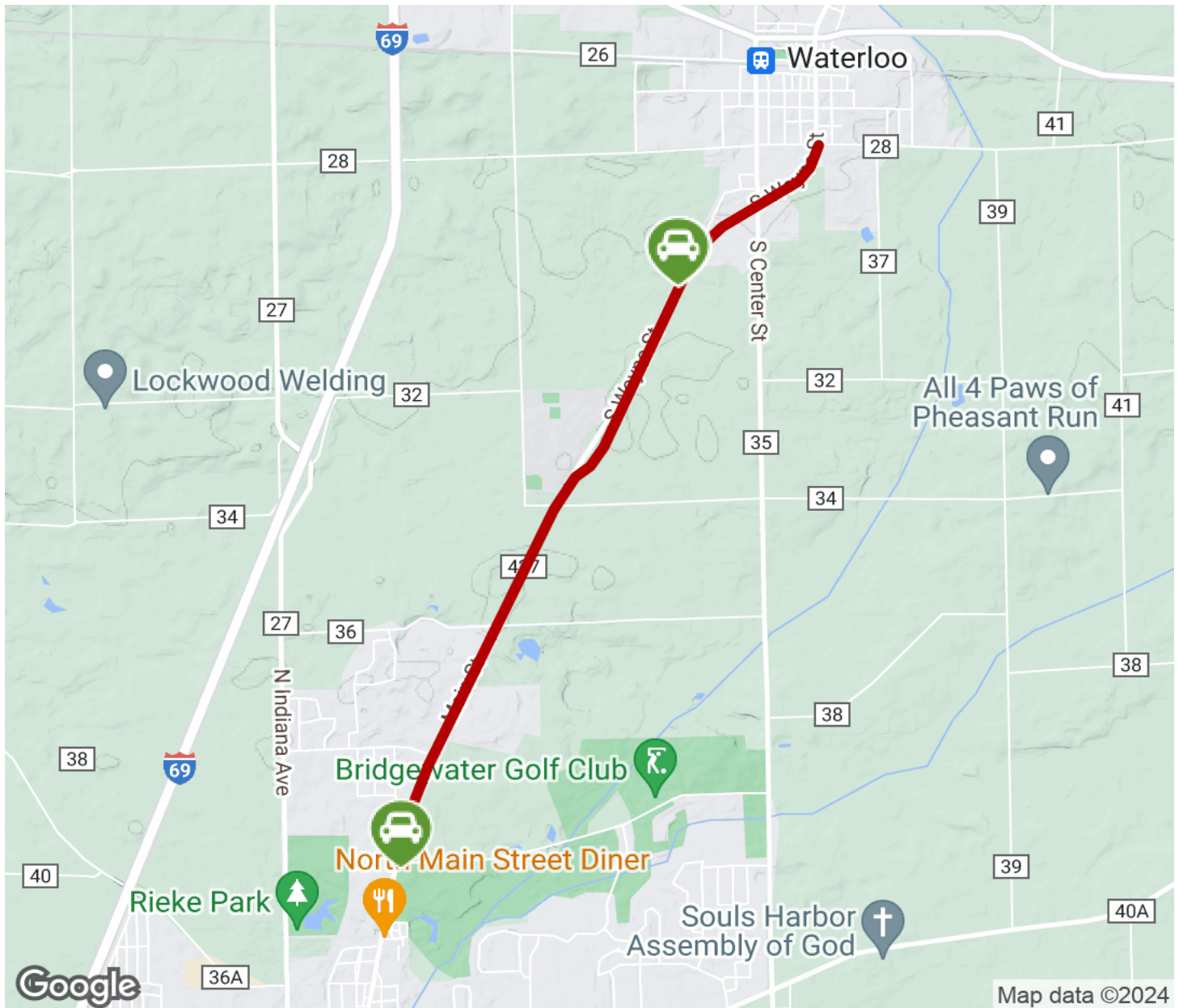
