Escondido Creek Bike Path *California*



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This paved trail along Escondido Creek can help residents commute to the Escondido Transit Center or to local services, as well as providing a pleasant opportunity for recreation. The trail connects to the <u>Inland Rail Trail</u> at the Transit Center, which will eventually run along the Sprinter line all the way to the coast in Oceanside, but currently offers a convenient pathway to San Marcos and Vista.

The creek is channelized through urban Escondido, and the trail hugs the edge. A small gap in the trail between North Quince Street and North Broadway was eliminated in 2019 thanks to a "Missing Link" project, which created new trail and protected bike lanes to allow for a much more seamless experience. Further improvements are in the works thanks to grant money from the state Parks &



Recreation Department, which will extend the trail slightly and improve large segments of the existing route, with work scheduled to start in 2022 or 2023.

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Parking & Trail Access


Free parking for the Escondido Creek Bike Path is available at the Escondido Transit Center (700 W. Valley Parkway).
