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The East 224 Connector Trail provides a convenient route through South Snyderville Basin from Willow Creek Park to the Redstone



The East 224 Connector Trail provides a convenient route through South Snyderville Basin from Willow Creek Park to the Redstone Shopping Complex. It meanders north along the former Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad right-of-way for just over a mile, then parallels State Route 224 before approaching the Swamer Nature Reserve, a scenic wetland and meadow habitat with an award-winning educational facility. The path is packed dirt and stone with two boardwalk segments through wetlands.

The trail connects to the asphalt-surfaced [224 Connector Trail](#) at its northern end and the [McLeod Creek Trail](#), [Split Rail Trail](#) and [Willow Creek Trail](#) to the south.

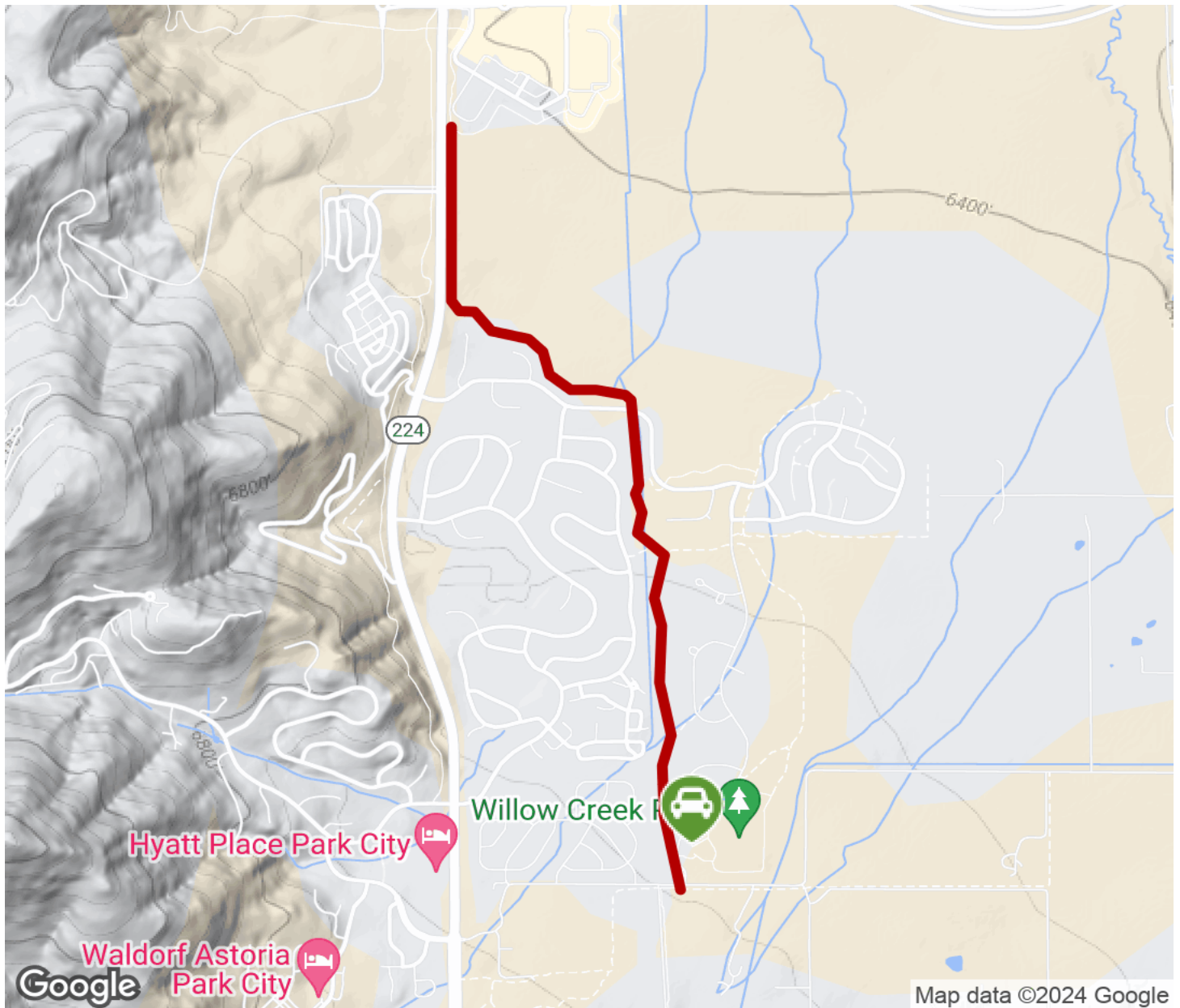
Parking & Trail Access
