The path runs through the heavily wooded northeast corner of the park, ending at the park road just north of Puri Crest Picnic Area. It was named after Sunil Puri, a Rockford businessman and philanthropist.

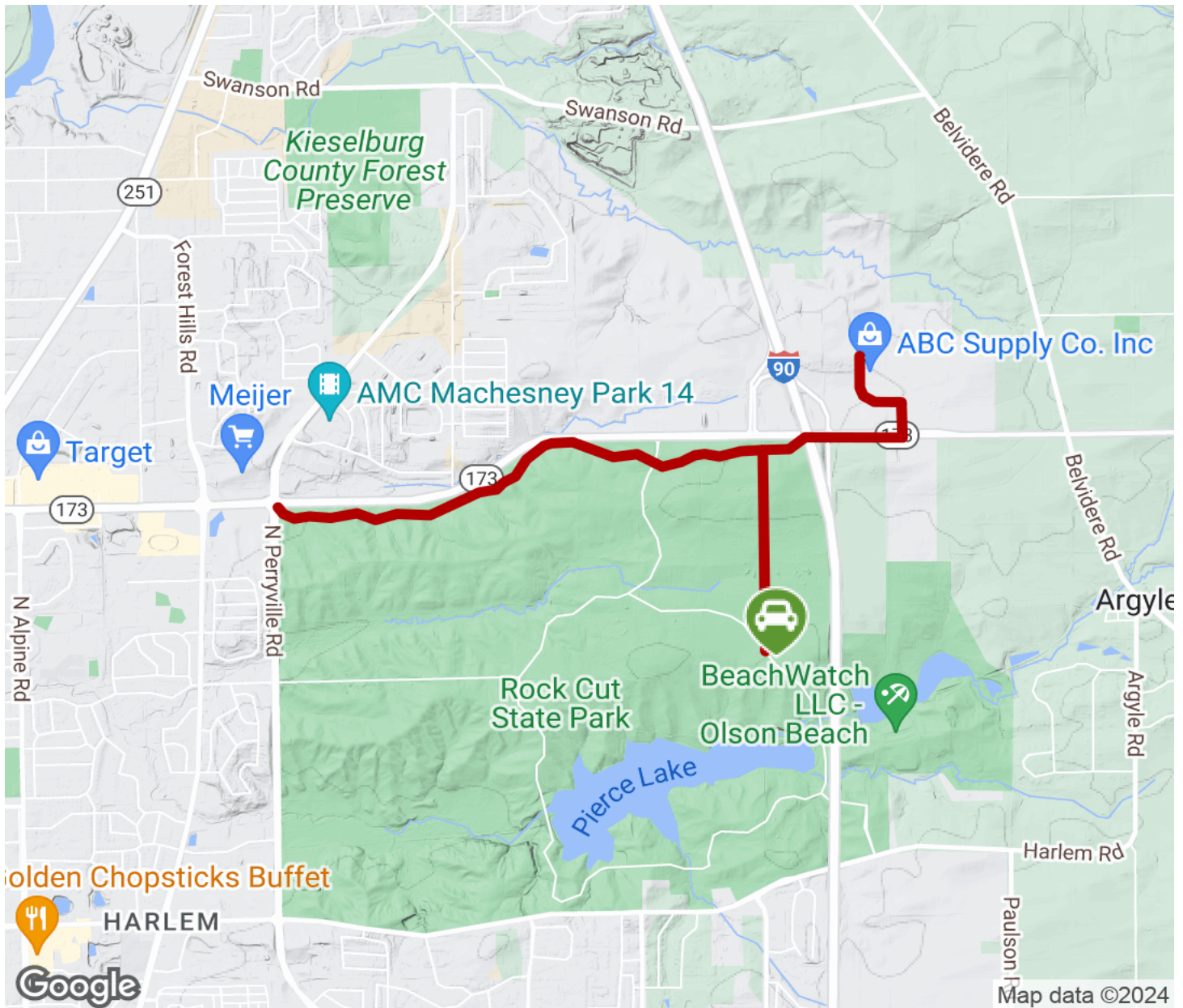
Parking & Trail Access
