The Laurel Creek Trail takes travelers into the Cherokee National Forest in Johnson County. There is no shortage of scenery in this wildlife rich-haven, where rushing waters slice through serene Appalachian forest. It's built on the former Pea Vine Railroad, a narrow gauge railroad built to ship lumber and manganese ore more than a century ago. Very little evidence of the original railroad can be seen today – the train ceased operations and the rails were removed back in the mid 1920's, when the metal and timber began to be depleted. But that route has received another lease on life, enhancing the economy and overall quality of life of the community of Laurel's Bloomery.

The trail is part of a multiyear plan to develop a trail network through Johnson County. The second phase will
